- (1) (a) Oval (egg shaped) fire ball with cone-shaped tail
- (b) Estimated to be 3 meters in diameter
- (c) Oval fire ball light red; area around forward two-thirds of oval was blue; diminishing cone trailing rearward from oval was light red surrounded by violet.
- (d) Three sighted individually by four people; were all identical

- (g) Cone-shaped tail was size of fire ball and its rear ogive diminished at an estimated 15 meters; smoke at rear of tail, which could be seen for about 2 seconds, appeared to be about 1.5 meters long; it was grey and contained red sparks
