<p>Unidentified flying object observed at <u>1100 hours</u>, <u>Z, 9 November 1957</u>, in the vicinity of <u>Fort Bragg, North Carolina</u>. The object was <u>round</u> in shape, about the size of <u>a baseball</u> and created a <u>buzzing noise</u>. The object approached from the <u>South</u> about <u>045 degrees</u> above the horizon, came to a stop above the observer, turned to about <u>045 degrees</u> and faded to the Northeast.</p> <p>By virtue of the observer being a member of a tank team it would seem that his evaluation of the situation could be accepted if he deemed it important enough to report.</p>
