Unidentified flying object observed at 1100 hours Z, 9 November 1957, in the vicinity of Fort Bragg, North Carolina. The object was round in shape, about the size of a baseball and created a buzzing noise. The object approached from the South about 045 degrees above the horizon, came to a stop above the observer, turned to about 045 degrees and faded to the Northeast.

By virtue of the observer being a member of a tank team it would seem that his evaluation of the situation could be accepted if he deemed it important enough to report.

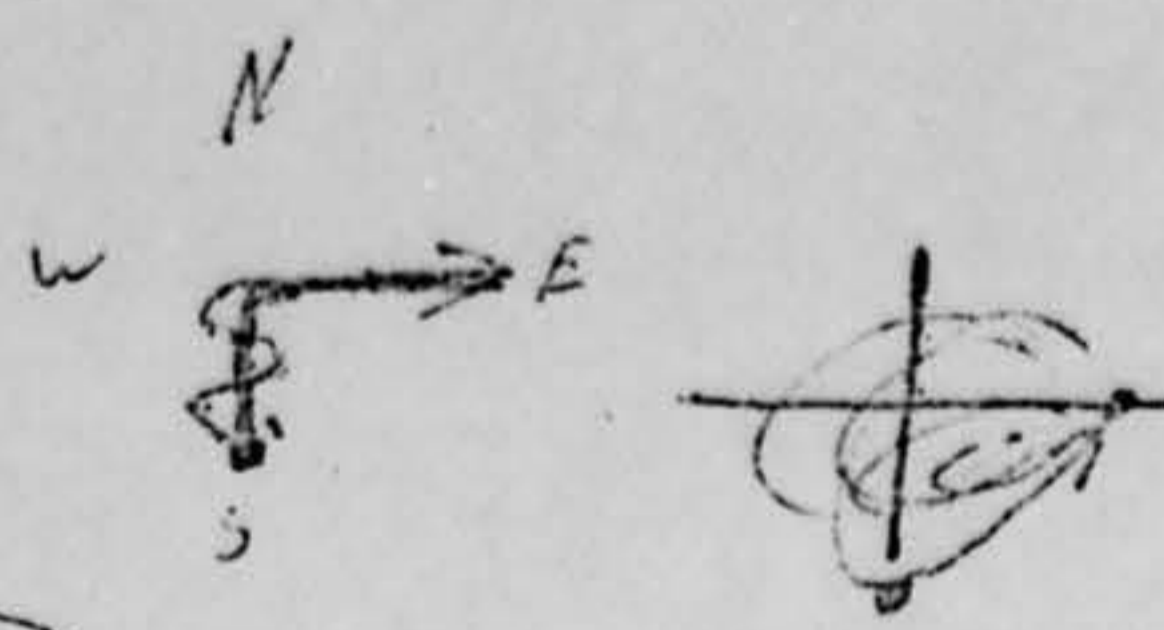
