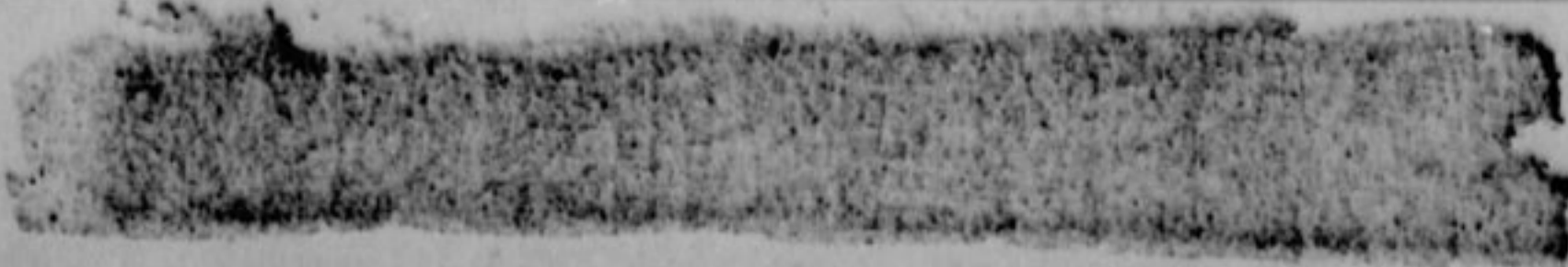

N43199 PILOT AND COPILOT SIGHTED OBJECT SIMILAR TO
SHOOTING STAR ONLY MUCH BRIGHTER AND BIGGER THAN USUAL.
OBJECT SIGHTED AT APPROX 1625Z APPROX 32 DEG TO RIGHT
OF AIRCRAFT HEADING. OBJECT APPEARED ABOUT 30 DEG ABOVE
HORIZON ALTITUDE UNKNOWN COURSE NNW TO SSE.
DURATION OF SIGHTING APPROX 2 SECONDS WITH OBJECT GIVING
OFF BLUISH WHITE LIGHT. TAIL AGAVE OFF BLUISH WHITE LIGHT
AND WAS APPROX 3 TIMES GREATER IN DIAMETER THAN OBJECT.
OBJECT DISINTEGRATED APPROX 20 DEG ABOVE HORIZON INTO FOUR
