Description Long-possibly pointed like ball pt pen, size 20 times as large as a B-47 , heard jet acft and looked up, first seen at 345 deg elev unk, disapp 025 deg elev unk, flt path to E., made 90 deg turn to N. with no apparent change in direction of flight, disapp due to loss of eye focus, seen for 4 seconds.

Analysis and Conclusions: The witness said that he heard a jet acft, yet the reporting officer stated that there were no known acft in the area. The witness could not determine the color due to the sun reflecting off of it. If the object was as large as the witness reported, it was enormous. Anything as large as the witness reported would have been seen and reported by many people. Only one witness saw it, so this report is evaluated as insufficient data, 1 witness.
