

While waiting to go to church (Now 9.40AM Sunday morning Standard Mountain Time) I read "The Family Fallout Shelter MP-15. My fellow chemists and other professional bourgeoisie "poh hughed" my efforts to prepare for and defend ourselves for an all out Atomic War, ever since Hiroshima.

The Powers case is your "baby".

On May 12 at 8.40 PM Standard Mountain Time I was sitting on the north ledge of the East enterance of the main building at Mark Kepel High School in the Alhambra School District of California. From what I told [redacted] on military observation of plane movements I estimate I saw a flying saucer traveling toward me and somewhat east. If interested I can take one of your military men and show the approximate movement between a tree and a light pole about a block away. As I first saw it in my bifocals I thought it might be a light refraction. But I took them off and it looked like a morning star (reddish like mars) except it had somewhat of a cross extension something like a spine on a enchinodermata.

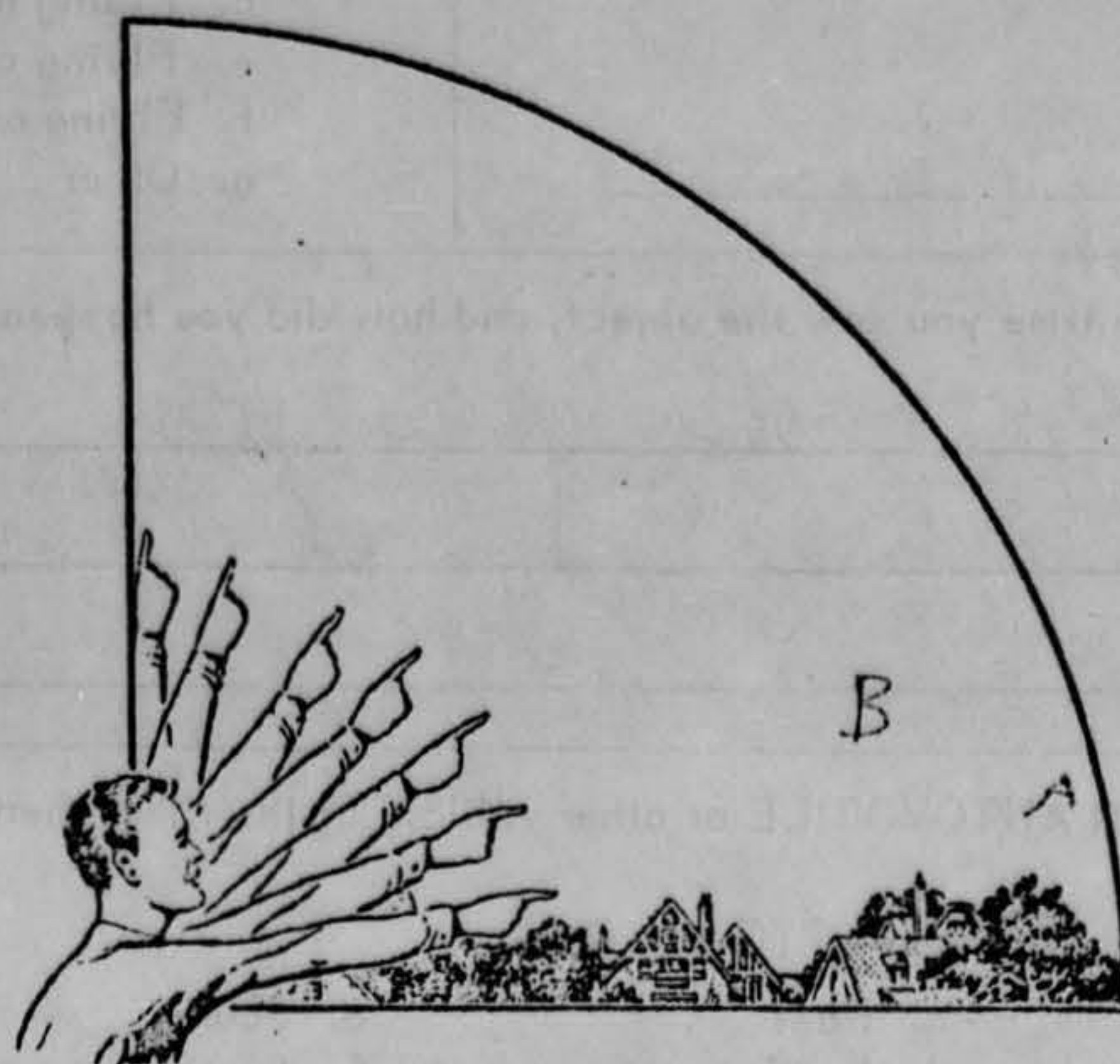
