At 0600 hours on approximately 16 May 1960 two low flying cigarette-shaped objects were sighted over the border area at Loftfabad Border Post. One object came from the direction of Soviet Ashkhabad, flew over the border area then returned once more in the direction of Ashkhabad. The second object also came from the direction of Ashkhabad, but continued flight toward Khakha. The vapor trail left by these objects remained intact for two hours, then gradually expanded in the pattern of dissipating con trails. The border commander who saw the objects was convinced that they were not jet planes. The objects were wingless and had no visible pilots. The source commented that there is no new construction in his area. There have been no additional sightings to date.
