Analysis and Conclusions: If the elevation reported by the witness was off by about 30 deg, the object could have been the star Spica. It is doubtful that the witness was that far off on his estimation, however. The sun had just set a few minutes prior to the sighting, and a weather balloon would appear to glow as it ascended into the sunlight. However, the object was reported to be stationary, and the duration was not reported to allow a determination if it was a balloon hovering a short time. Due to the duration of the sighting not being reported, a valid conclusion cannot be made.
