Dear Sir:

On the night of Friday, July 8th, 1960 [redacted] and myself [redacted] were playing ball outside of the Hawthorne Memorial Pool in Hawthorne, New Jersey when I looked up and saw a blob of white light about the size of a quarter traveling across the sky to the approximate northwest. This we took to be a flying saucer as it traveled across approximately one sixth of the sky before it disappeared approximately 5-7 seconds after we first sighted it. We estimated the altitude at which it was flying at approximately 25,000 ft. using a cirrus cloud as a guide.

We would like to know if there were any military or commercial planes flying over this area at 8:16 P.M. July 8th, 1960

We would appreciate it if you would reply with the necessary information.
