THAN MAIN BODY. TAIL WAS A BLEND OF ORANGE AND RED IN COLOR. OBJECT APPEARED TO BE TRAVELING HORIZONTALLY AND WAS OBSERVED ABOUT 8 SECONDS BEFORE DISAPPEARING FROM SIGHT. IN ADDITION, AT LEAST 2 DEPENDENT CHILDREN AND SEVERAL NCO PERSONNEL IN SAME LOCALE OBSERVED PHENOMENON. THEIR DESCRIPTION GENERALLY AGREES WITH BUT IS NOT AS COMPLETE AS THAT OF COL. [REDACTED]. ALSO, US ARMY MAJOR, THIS COMMAND, ON TDY IN LIVORNO, ITALY, MADE SAME SIGHTING 18 JUL IN LIVORNO AREA. HE HOLDS TIME OF HIS SIGHTING AS ABOUT 1930Z. END QUOTE.
