Size of half-dollar to grapefruit at arm's length. Moved very fast upwards to about 60 deg and then downward in an arc and disappeared over the horizon			11. COMMENTS It has been determined from interviews description and duration that the object of this sighting was a meteor. On occasion the appearance of rising is present and as the distance from the observer increases the object then has the appearance of descent. Also evaluated meteor by astronomers at Griffith Observatory.



SUBJECT: Final Report on UFO Sighting

TO: Air Technical Intelligence Center  
Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio

1. Reference TWX SBBFD-8-3E, UFO, 032345Z August. All personnel having knowledge of the UFO Sighting reported in this message were interviewed and their information recorded on audio tape. These tapes have been transcribed and the transcriptions placed on file at Base Operations, Norton AFB.
2. Evaluation of the sighting as reported and interview with personnel of the Griffith Park Observatory, Los Angeles, indicated that the object sighted was a meteorite.
3. It is recommended that this case be considered closed.
