WHAT WAS THE ELEVATION OF THE OBJ WHEN IT WAS FIRST AND LAST SEEN? AFTER ONE MINUTE OF OBSERVATION, DID THE OBJ DIMINISH IN SIZE, OR DID IT DISAPPEAR LIKE TURNING OUT A LIGHT, ETC? DEW POINT 48 (DEGREES F.). WESTERLY WINDS 4 THOUSAND TO 12 THOUSAND FEET AT 18 KNOTS. LOCAL AND STATE POLICE NEGATIVE CIVILIAN REPORTS. LOCAL MILITARY CHECK NEGATIVE.
