Observed as it passed Regulus. DAKEM		11. COMMENTS Description, duration and pattern fit that of EDC I, however it was not launched until 6 hours later. Object observed as it passed Regulus. Star chart indicated that Regulus set two hours earlier, and was below the NW horizon. Object moved in wrong direction for balloon and no known A/C in area. Insufficient Data for evaluation although indications are that the object was EDC I and the date and time in error.
