10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING One light was observed in NE, then at 0045 four more lights were seen; all 5 lights seemed to form an arc. 4 objects seen later were not as bright as the first. They appeared stationary for some period of time, they changed direction suddenly. Edges like a bright star. An unceasing whirling sound was heard the preceding and following days of the sighting.		11. COMMENTS First object in view 1 hr 10 min before others were noticed; witnesses do not say what elevation of objects was, but if they were looking over the lake they could have seen the star Capella about 15° above the NNE horizon, the direction they were looking. Constellations Taurus and Orion are beginning to rise at this time. It is possible that these stars were what was seen.



OBSERVATION DATA RE UFO

1. Sighted August 31, 1960 beginning at 11:35 P.M., Central Daylight Saving Time.
2. Sighted from residence: 3rd floor apartment at 1335 West Fargo Avenue, Chicago 26, Illinois; apartment overlooks Lake Michigan.
3. Object was viewed until 1:25 A.M; I am certain of this answer.
4. The condition of the sky was clear, no trace of daylight.
5. There were only a few stars; no moonlight.
6. The object was brighter than the background of the sky.
7. The brightness was like that of a distant automobile headlight.
8. The object appeared to stand still (hover) for some periods of time; it also changed brightness; at one point it suddenly changed direction (suddenly).
9. At no time did it move behind anything.

11. The object appeared solid.
12. The observations were made through eyeglasses & binoculars.
13. An unceasing whirling sound was heard; this was also heard during daylight the previous day & the following day; there weren't any visible sources of the sound (ventilating units, motorboats, etc.).
14. The edges of the object were like a very bright star.
15. At approximately 12:45 A.M. 4 similar objects were sighted; they were not as bright as the first object; they also moved; all five objects seemed to form an arc.
16. Colors observed were green, yellow & red.
17. Observations were made from a residential section of the city.
18. When first sighted we were looking in a Northeasterly direction.
19. When observations ceased we were looking in a North Northeasterly direction.
20. The sky was clear, no clouds; no wind; weather dry; temperature hot.
