

## OBSERVATION DATA HE UTO

1. Sighted August 31, 1960 beginning at 11:35 P.M., Central Daylight Saving Time.

2. Sighted from residence: 3rd floor apartment at 1335 West Fargo Avenue, Chicago 26, Illinois; apartment overlooks Lake Michigan.

3. Object was viewed until 1:25 A.M; I am certain of this answer.

4. The condition of the sky was clear, no trace of daylight.

5. There were only a few stars; no moonlight.

6. The object was brighter than the background of the sky.

7. The brightness was like that of a distant automobile headlight.

8, The object appeared to stand still (hover) for some periods of time; it also changed brightness; at one point it suddenly changed direction (suddenly).

9. At no time did it move behind anything.

11. The object appeared solid.

12. The observations were made through eyeglasses & binoculars.
