Oct. 13, 1960

North Haven

I have seen in the newspapers
sometimes ago, that the Defense Dept.
consider
U.F.O.s as serious business. Why?

Here is the reason that I am ask-
ing you this question. On Sept. 2, (1960),
my son (14), my daughter (9) and myself
saw a very strange sight, in fact I
have never seen anything like
this before. We were at Munroe
Falls Lake. It was a bright, clear
cloudless day. It was a little past
3 when we saw this thing silver colored,
cigar shaped object. The top had a
slight rise to it (like a blister). It
came from the west with a wobble
in the N.E. direction. About 4 or 5 min-
utes later we saw another one of these
objects coming from the same Wth
direction. When it got half way
across the sky, we heard a thin
saw or plane of a tone it. The object
made a very sharp turn (west), and
quickly disappeared about 10 minutes

later, another one of these objects
appeared from the same direction.
This one also made a sharp turn,
whose plane went after it. We saw
4 more of these objects, 7 in all. The
last one appearing about 4:15.
Once we saw 2 in the sky at the
same time. One was like a pinpoint
in the NE, when the other one app-
eared in the W. W. The second from
the last object turned W. even be-
fore it reached halfway in the sky.
All 7 of these objects came from the
North West direction. These things did
not have wings. They did not change
color, nor did we see any vapor
or anything like that coming from
them.

I would appreciate hearing from
you on this matter.

the last one appearing about 4:15.
They all had the same appearance and

in our 2 of these objects were they at
one time. One was like a open point
in the NW. when another one came from
the NW. The second one from the east
turned north before it got a way
away. The objects did not have wings.
We didn't see any vapor or anything
like that coming from them. They
also remained the same distance
above us.
