The speed of the UFO was estimated to be 6 times as fast as Echo I. The UFO was also observed by Mrs. [REDACTED] and a neighbor, Mrs. [REDACTED].

Analysis and Conclusions: There were no satellites reported to be reentering this time. Although the elevation of the object was not reported when it was first seen, the duration reported suggests that the object was moving at meteoric speeds. The witness reports that the speed of the objects was about 6 times that of bone 1. If this was true, the object should have been in view much longer than that reported. The object observed was probably a very low meteor that made the noise heard, and was either observed to pass out of the earth's atmosphere, or burned out in the dense lower air.
