THE OBSERVER DID SOUND SINCERE IN A TELEPHONE CONVERSATION. IT IS FELT HERE THAT NO ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN BECAUSE THERE WERE NOT ENOUGH WITNESSES TO THE SIGHTING. THE OBJECTS WERE NOT OBSERVED ON THE RADAR SCOPE AND THERE IS NO PHYSICAL EVIDENCE OF IT. THIS REPORT POSSIBLY CONNECTED WITH MOON DUST ALERT.

PHYSICAL EVIDENCE OF IT. THIS REPORT POSSIBLY CONNECTED WITH MOON  
DUST ALERT.
