Bright red color appeared below the UFO intermittently and the color was streaked, but did not appear to be exhaust. Objects seemed to zig zag. Both objects disappeared by falling below the horizon.  <u>Satellites</u>		11. COMMENTS Strong possibility that object which was first observed was planet Venus. As the planet set, atmospheric refraction was responsible for distortion and apparent motions causing the misidentification. It is not understood why witnesses thought objects disappeared in S and N. The bright star Spica (Virgo) was probably one of objects distorted by atmospheric refraction in same way as Venus. Spica set just before Venus and could account for time difference. Spica mag 1.2. Venus mag -3.3.
