PLANETS JUPITER AND SATURN ARE PRESENTLY APPEARING ABOVE THE HORIZON AT DUSK. IT IS POSSIBLE THEM TO BE OBSERVED IN THE SAME MANNER AND COLOR AS THE REPORTED UFO.
