PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS: FROM CHECKING WITH PILOTS ASSIGNED TO THE 125
FIGHTER SQ, WIS: AIR GUARD, A STRONG LIKELIHOOD EXISTS THAT THE
SUPPOSED UFO'S WERE TWO F89J'S FROM THIS BASE. THESE JETS WERE
FLYING AT 32,000 FEET. I DISCUSSED THE POSSIBILITY WITH LT. LAND.
HE COULD NOT ZERO THE TIME IN DEFINITELY BUT, HE SAID THEY WERE FLYING OVER JANESVILLE APPROXIMATELY DURING THE TIME DESIGNATED BY
