B. DESCRIPTION OF COURSE OF OBJECT:

(1) INDIVIDUAL WAS STAR GAZING ON A SIDEWALK SITUATED IN THE CENTER OF THE CITY, APPROXIMATELY 43 DEGREES, TWO MINUTES NORTH, 78 DEGREES, 52 MINUTES WEST. HE NOTICED OBJECT NR1 TRAVELING IN A NORTHEASTERLY DIRECTION AND WATCHED OBJECT FOR APPROXIMATELY 30 SECONDS UNTIL IT VEERED TO THE SOUTH BEHIND AN OBSTACLE. TURNING TO A 65 DEGREE ANGLE, HE SPOTTED OBJECTS NR 2 AND NR3 TRAVELING IN A SOUTHERLY DIRECTION. ESTIMATE SPEED OF OBJECTS 500 MILES PER HOUR.
