OBJECT LOST BEARING 180 POSITION ANGLE 40 TIME 0138R. OBJECT DEFINITELY NOT A/C OR SHOOTING STAR. INITIAL BRILLIANCE SLIGHTLY BRIGHTER THAN FIRST MAGNITUDE THEN STEADILY DIMINISHING. PERHAPS POSSIBLE RUSSIAN MARS SHOT IN VIEW PROPITIOUS CONDITIONS THIS DATE AS REPORTED ON THURSDAY 13 OCT NEWSPAPER. POSITION 23-59N 30-23/2E
