





appear to be gliding. They don't hold a straight course like an airplane. They move up and down and circle around, like birds seen them going one way and they circle and start in another direction. At times they stand perfectly still then suddenly they dart off.

I had finally dismissed the idea from my mind, as had finally dismissed the idea from my mind, but myself, it was probably a phantasm of the imagination. It has always been in the St. Lawrence Seaway. It has always been in the north and they travel from east to west or west to east. Birds have passed each other and different colored ones. 7 PM at 11:30 I turned out the lights to go to bed and stood at picture window looking at stars again a huge red star in the north, suddenly broke off and headed east, watched it out of sight and then spotted an orange one in the quadrant moving east.

As long as they stayed in the north I thought of the St. Lawrence Seaway Patrol, but they are too much off their course for that.

I do care about this good old United States and the good old earth. I think most of us just take everything for granted - a human failing. I just hope you don't consider me a crackpot, though I will confess, I feel like one at first. Then my husband, son & daughter seen it too and seeing it every night, can't be a phenomenon.

I do hope you can set my mind at ease. Possibly, if it is a secret you can't divulge, could you possibly just write and say "OK", no explanation will be needed and I can stop star gazing, as it is good pneumonia time now. Also, bird on the eye, we have seen all this with the naked eye and say "OK", not unusual. Please write and say "OK".

BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING:

There is a regular airplane route overland I mean goes literally going north & south recovering. There used to be one on north side of house. There used to be one on south side of house going east, going west - older side of house. But since this older route started, the direct east-west route stopped. What gets me is the way the crazy things act when an airplane is in area - they are not for the birds. rockers! But here it is and all of them rockers too.

I tried telling myself at first that perhaps the
one object was a magnetic stalk, then decided it
was the Zeiss Balloon, but after seeing it go after
airplanes - that scared me. I wondered too if it could
be a radar station & as it goes after or toward
the planes, then recedes as if it responds to a
message. See what imagination can do!

I think there is a probable explanation to all
of these objects - I surely hope so. I have no way of
knowing or judging distance in the sky and realize that
distance might give you a false impression.

But a good many of us have seen it with the naked
eye, and that is the way I have always seen it.
All alone, though we are alone & now binoculars or

The object viewed by Rev [REDACTED] and Mrs [REDACTED] could possibly have been a mirage or some common object. When talking with Rev [REDACTED] this possibility was pointed out to him and he accepted it as a possibility.

7. It has been impossible to obtain the weather data for the area due to its being in transit to the storage depot in North Carolina. Absence of the weather data makes it impossible to determine if weather was a factor in the [REDACTED] sighting. This sighting will be given further consideration after the weather data has been obtained.

8. In view of the limited data, it is impossible to state definitely the cause of the sightings by Mrs [REDACTED]. The tone of this witness, both from her letters and the telephone conversation, indicates that she is very high strung. It is quite possible that this witness has been observing common objects under unusual conditions, and due to her distraught condition, let her imagination expand upon the illusion which resulted in her viewing the object as a possible threat.




