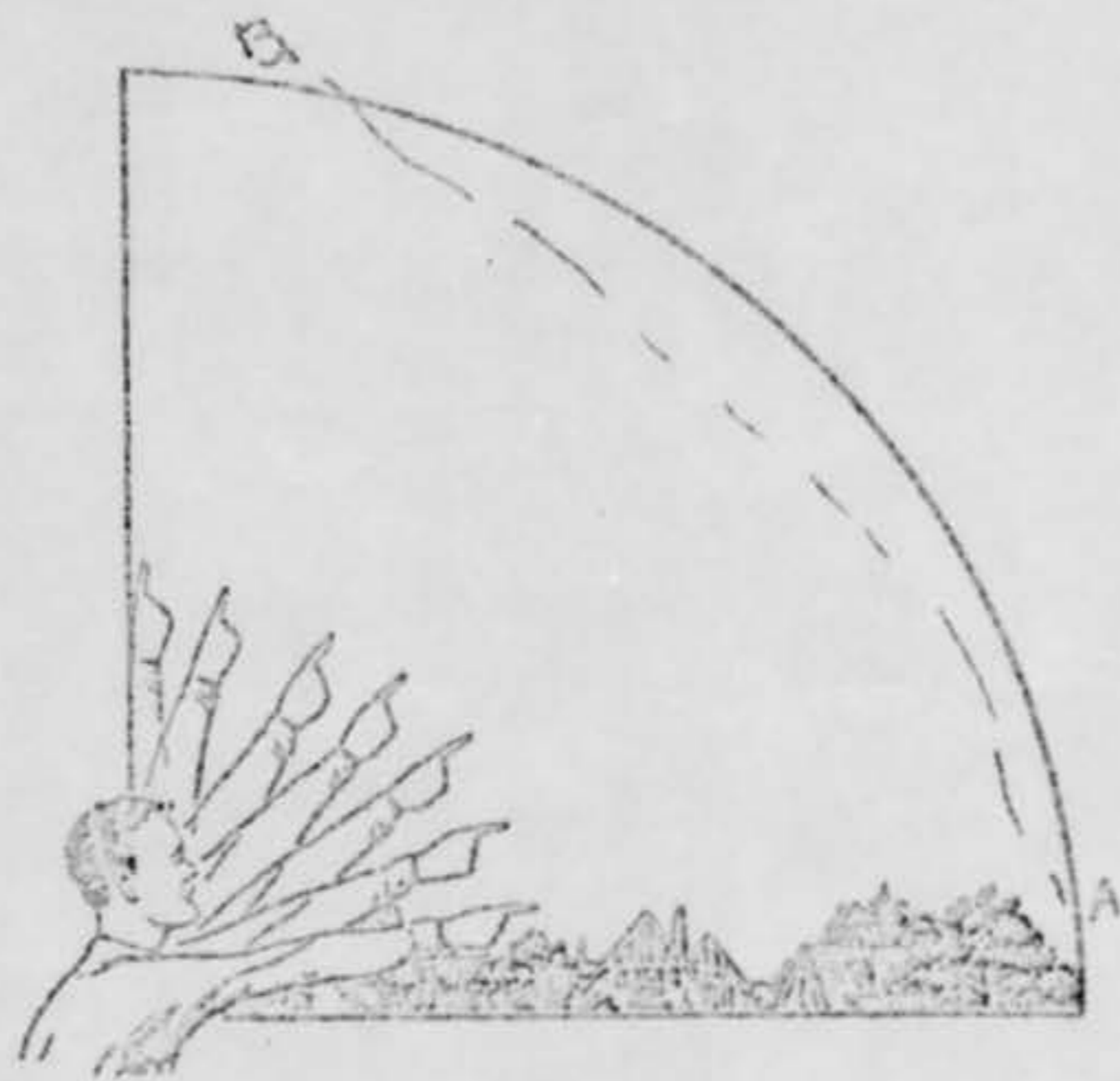


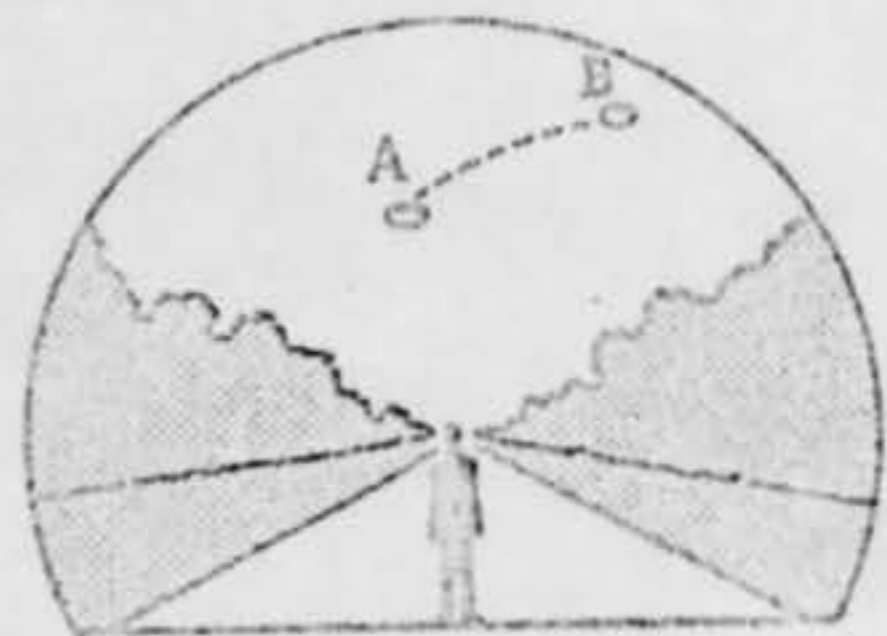
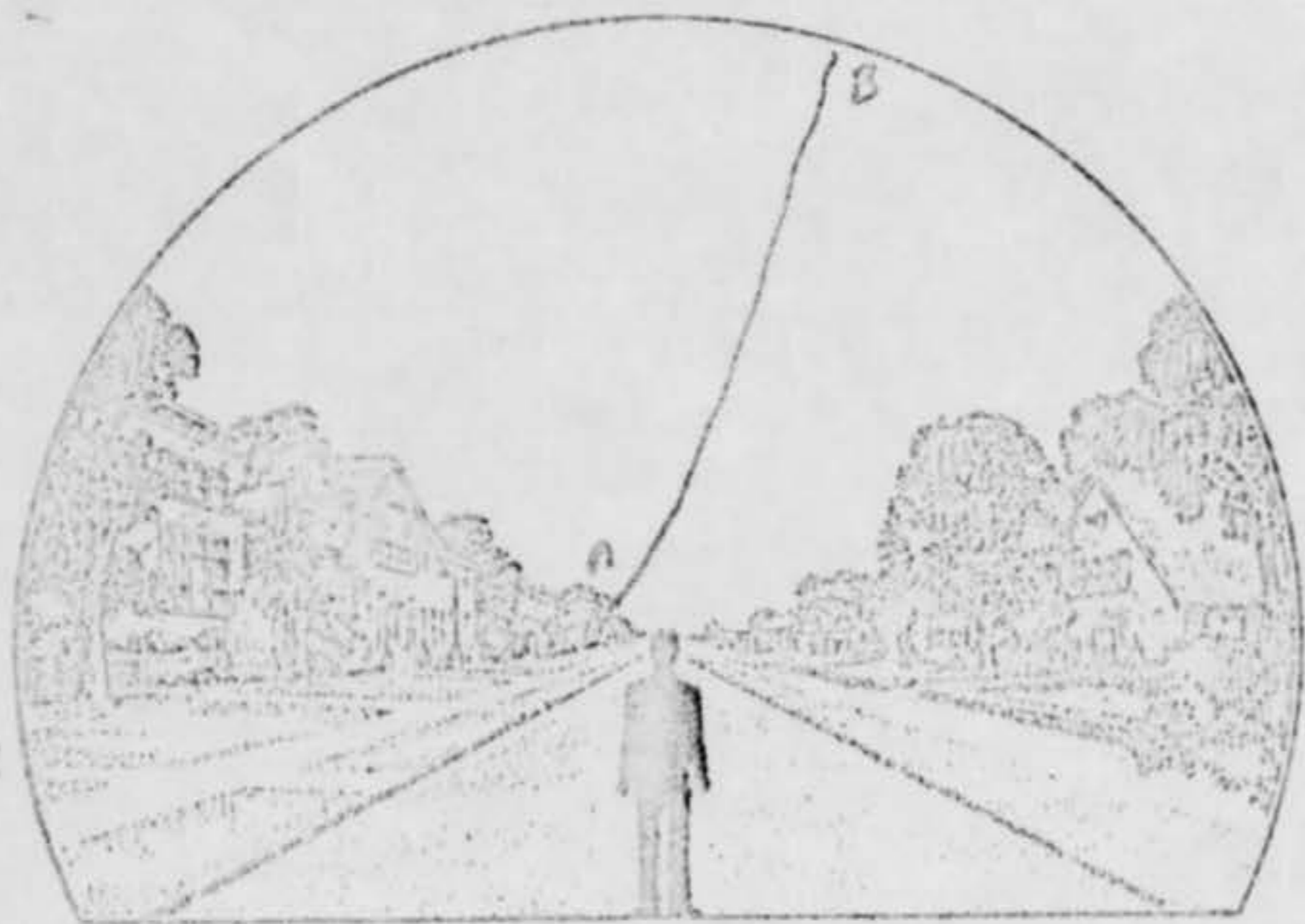

Objects were reported to appear in E and N and have erratic movements. Objects were brighter than planets and displayed colors that appeared as a spectrum.			11. COMMENTS Witness visited by Major Friend. After discussion with her the following facts were evident. Witness was never very specific and always used terms such as big, fast, huge, etc. However the information which is factual tends to indicate that a mirage was the cause of the various sightings. Due to lack of specific data it is impossible to determine the exact light sources for these observations.



Dear Sara -

Through watching Eker T this summer, I became quite interested in our firmament. I went out every evening, not only to see Eker T, but to locate the different planets and constellations.

While watching the sky, many planes go over, but we have seen some things that are not planes and act mighty queer. We started to see these objects - possibly the latter part of July, but I know we have seen them every night in Aug., Sept. & Oct.

I have hesitated to say anything as usually anyone reporting an oddity, is branded a crackpot. So I have been waiting for someone else to be called the crackpot. I had read an article in paper that said they wanted people to report anything strange they seen.

The objects we have seen are all one color, either all red, or all orange, or all in bright yellow - like a star. They flash off and on - that is the appearance coming toward you or going away from you, but once they are in view, usually to see the whole object - they don't flash and are a solid red, orange or yellow. There are no green lights on them at all, and there is no planes, and there is absolutely no noise. Most of the time, they move very slow,

appear to be gliding. They don't hold a straight course like an airplane. They move up and down and circle around, have been seen them going one way and they circle and start in another direction. At times they stand perfectly still then suddenly they dart off. I had finally dismissed the idea from my mind by telling myself, it was probably a patrol of the St. Lawrence Seaway. It has always been in the north and they travel from east to west or west to east. Waves were passed in both other and different colored ones. You can watch them for 15 to 20 minutes out of sight.

Last night Oct. 24, at about 8:45 P.M. my son was sitting on a chair in our living room, which has a large picture window facing east and he called my attention to something red coming toward us. We went out on porch, heard the noise and soon a plane went directly over ^{over} house. I stood there watching the stars as there are so many big ones now in the east. I saw a large red one, blinking, and was about to join him, when this supposedly star, took off and headed east, then south, circled and headed north, then east again. It was not blinking when standing still, only a twinkling or pulsing. There was absolutely no noise.

Then at 11:30 P.M. I turned out the lights to go to bed and stood at picture window looking at stars. Again a huge red star in the north, suddenly broke off and headed east, watched it out of sight and then spotted an orange one in the southeast moving east.

As long as they stayed in the north I thought of the St. Lawrence Seaway Patrol, but they are too much off their course for that.

I do care about this good old United States and this good old earth. I think most of us just take everything for granted - a human failing. I just hope you don't consider me a crackpot, though I will confess, I felt like one at first. Then my husband, son & daughters seen at tea and seeing it every night, I can't be a phenomenon.

I do hope you can set my mind at ease. Possibly, if it is a secret you can't divulge, could you possibly just write and say "OK" no explanation will be needed and I can stop star gazing, as it is good pneumonia time now. Also - "hard on the eyes" - we have seen all this with the naked eye - no binoculars or telescope don't concern me. Please write and say "OK".

EVALUATION: CASE CATEGORY: PROBABLY A MIRAGE

CONCLUSION: THE WITNESS IN THIS CASE WAS NEVER VERY SPECIFIC, USING SUCH NON-SPECIFIC ADJECTIVES AS BIG, FAST, HUGE ETC. HOWEVER, THE INFORMATION WHICH IS INCLUDED IN THE REPORT POINTS TOWARD MIRAGES AS A CAUSE. DUE TO THE LACK OF INFORMATION IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO DETERMINE THE EXACT LIGHT SOURCES RESPONSIBLE IN EACH INSTANCE.

Dear Sirs.

One thing I didn't report to you was a supposed star that acted queer and I seen it most of summer and all fall - even now I don't recall the date that I first seen it acting up - but that night I called ~~Mr. [redacted]~~ or tried to call a Mr. ~~[redacted]~~ who was a teacher at Heikberg college. Unable to call him, as he had left for New Jersey for a new teaching job I called Rev. ~~[redacted]~~ of Ft. Seneca. I looked out at sky thinking I would catch a glimpse of what I - stood for a moment watching and a white, milky looking object, shape of a cone or oblong part from west going east. 

That attracted my attention to this other object which was going in a counter clock wise movement and going toward east but gradually getting higher. I knew I would have access to the observatory at college that was why I called him. It was about 10 PM that evening when I first seen this object. I couldn't believe my own eyes, so I went on floor and braced myself against wall and then on window sill. My husband and I were sitting on the floor, he thought it might give a counter clockwise movement, I tried to call our Daily Paper - The Advertiser Tribune - no answer - you can't get the sheriff - nobody - I do recall it was in Aug. as it was only several weeks till school would start. Also that we turned on TV to get the 11 PM news, Warren Tribune came on and never said anything, then Tol 6013 came on with local news and his last words were - "If you are watching in the east about 12 or 1 o'clock you will see the ten story balloon that Johns put up tonight." So after that I dismissed it from my mind as the John balloon. Nothing was ever said in our paper about it, do they take it down every night then send it back up every night? Is it still in existence, it comes up in N.E.

 I called the ^{Linn} County Civil Defense Director ^{Sam}
 [redacted] ^{Oct. 30,} to see the crazy object. Finally we got my
 family out too and they were amazed. I had called
 a young fellow up from ^{7 mi. nite} Oct 28, to have him bring
 his binoculars over. We watched it from 6:30 P.M.
 to 8:30 P.M. Then fog got so thick ^{them up into}
 sky, you could only see occasionally. The ^{then}
 County Civil Defense Director - Mr. M. [redacted] ^{Came}
 out from ^{7 mi. nite} and brought binoculars - he viewed it
 and said it was no star and it was not a capture
 balloon - such as ^{Schick has}. The air was full
 of planes and the crazy object would start

Oct. 31
 I wasn't watching the sky last nite as it was
 quite cloudy. I happened to look out about 9 P.M.
 and sky was fairly clear and moon and stars
 were out. I looked out a north window and low
 and behold - there was this crazy thing right
 straight north of our house - it was circling around
 then suddenly headed west or a way there.
 turned and came east. Watched it quite awhile
 and it suddenly disappeared. I tried to contact
 [redacted] again. But he was gone. When he
 was ^{7 mi. nite} he called Toledo

from here and they looked at it, said they had
a restricted view, but could see spiraling, no
~~more~~ wanted them to send the fighter squadrons

But last night the air was full of planes
earlier and I thought maybe that was the
reason the object had changed position. It
has always stayed on east side of road near
the road and low when it first makes its appear-
ance - then gradually spiral until it will
be high in east - but during spiraling it will
be a straight course at times to either N, S,
E, or W. Last night I seen one of those red-blinking
or flashing objects go over top of it, then only went
a short ways and turned back towards it, made
a flash or two and it was never seen again. It
looked like an orange and also a red one came
off of it.

While we were standing there talking I spotted
as red light - appeared like be in a tree top,
soon we saw it move and it was blinking
and it glowed an orangish red just like the
one that was close to our house. The next we
stood on porch and watched the plane go over. I
wrote you about that one. At first we thought
it was Mars but a planet don't blink or move

in clock wise ⁵ and counter of course
motions, we seen it from the side as it headed
south and north and as it turned you could
see a small white light on it - which was
an auto tail light with red glass broken
out or as an electric light bulb. While we
were watching this my son spotted another
one just down north of this one over tree
tops of woods. The other one was straight east

If I could talk to you or if you could see these things - then you would know - or have you seen them? Also - how many other nuts have reported it? I hate about the way I feel - but really I'm not. I'm quite normal, and don't tip the bottle - but I don't want to drink a person to drink. I have worried about it for the fact that I don't want to see our country invaded and stole from us. They might be unfriendly objects instead of friendly. If they are unfriendly they are sure getting an eye full of us and surrounding territory. They are absolutely noiseless - unless distance would be the same and they don't look that far away. I

Can hear jets from all directions when you can't see them and also when you can see them or at least the stream they leave behind in the sky. There is a regular airplane route over ^{Washington} and I mean over, literally, going N.W. to S.E. and vice versa. There used to be one on north side of house going west - other side of house going east. But since this other route started, the direct east-west route stopped. What gets me is the way the Crazy things act when an airplane is in area - they are not for the birds. You don't see them in the daytime, anywhere from 6:30 P.M. on, anxiously awaiting that "OK" or "none of your business!" Then maybe my nerves will quit down.

5. Telephone contact was made with the Erie Ordnance Depot to determine if any testing by them could be responsible. Firings at the depot have been conducted only between the hours of 0700 and 1300 during week days. Mrs ██████████ sightings always occurred between sunset and midnight.
6. It seems strange that Mrs ██████████ is the only person reporting objects from the area; if indeed, there were objects there such as she described.

Dear Sara -

Enclosed you will find a letter I was going to send to Board Creek, Mich. I intended to send it until I received word from them on my first letter. Also, because anyone reading the letter, unless they actually seen these objects, would think, to use an expression - "She's off her rocker". But if I am, there are a good deal more that have seen it and are off their rocker too.

I tried telling myself at first that perhaps the one object was a magnetic star, then decided it was the Johns Ballon, but after seeing it go after airplanes - that scared me. I wondered too if it could be a radar station, as it goes after or toward the planes, then recedes as if it responds to a message. See what imagination can do!

I think there is a probable explanation to all of these objects - I surely hope so. I have no way of knowing or judging distance in the sky and realize that distance might give you a false impression.

But a good many of us have seen it with the naked eye, and that is the way I have always seen all these things, as we don't own binoculars or telescope.

I wish I knew someone in our community that had a knowledge of all the stars. I never saw any stars beyond like this before.

If you know about these objects and if
because of our country's national security you
cannot send an explanation, could you at least
write and say "ok" or "mind your own business".
It does worry me when I think it could be
a menace to our United States.


My husband says that some people are watching
the skies all the time and you would know about it.
But if everybody was like me they wouldn't tell
anyone - for fear of being branded a crack-pot. The
only way I get up nerve enough to write, was after
I persuaded a few others to stand still long
enough to see it. Because at times these objects will
set perfectly still - then suddenly start their dither.
Another reason I got off writing or notifying anyone,
is a logical explanation, and that it is part of
our national security. My son is only 13 but quite
interested in Science and he gives me a scientific
explanation. I hope they are both right.

I guess I'll just have to find a job to keep me
busy so I won't have time to aim my eyes at
the skies.

So hope you can send - OK.

Dear Sirs -

The additional information enclosed I held back, waiting for word from you.

Yesterday, Thurs. Nov. 10, I received a phone call supposed to be from Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton. Later in the day, "a hell of a bang"; the thought came to me - was it really from Dayton, I called the Long Distance Operator at Tiffin and she said it was impossible to check where the call came from. I was questioned as to size, shape, color, direction and distance. There was not much I could tell them, as I have no way of knowing distance in the sky. I think a scientist could figure the distance if he knew the true size of a given object. Like my son told me how many millions of our earths could be placed inside the sun, that is scientific data.

I also mentioned Prof. ~~██~~ at Ft. Seneca. I heard he started out studying to be a scientist but switched and became a minister. The only thing Mr. ~~██~~ seen was what I referred to in enclosed letter as the Solar Ballon.

I got in touch with him yesterday after the call from Dayton and told him he may be mistaken. He said that he knew the object he saw with naked eye and also with his telescope was not a star; and had settled his mind to the idea it was the Soho Balloon, after I heard the news report. When I first sighted it, I dismissed it with the idea that it was a magnetic star, then later the Soho Balloon, now I even think it may be a radar station - some imagination! It is fascinating to watch - goes toward the planets, then like there is a signal it recedes. First sighted this object in Aug. and it was the only one, but has watched 4 of them in their capers all at the same time, but they are in different locations. Sometimes they act like a normal star should, then suddenly start their didos. If they are stars, they are wild ones as they desert their constellations. As you can watch a whole constellation such as the big dipper, and the whole thing will gradually be farther north and from here it works to the north and east.

I never knew so many balloons were released
in one day or at any time. Having never seen
one, it could be possible that the orange-red object
with a long white light, could be a hot air balloon
operated by a running light on a balloon. If they
were balloons, Council Clockhouse, ascend and
descend, blink or flash at times - that's it.
I was told the other boys that the growing grounds
at St. Cinton may be responsible for these objects.

Also early in the spring I seen a grey station
wagon with white lettering on that said U.S.
Government, State of Mich. on our road County Rd.

2 men got out, looked at telephone pole and wires,
then continued down road north to first road, left
one man out, the other came back almost to our
house, stopped, took out a long skinning rod,
walked over to a phone pole and I would say
measured height from ground. He came up to our
drives, turned around - headed north again
and parked on side road. The two men took
a ladder and other apparatus - back into the
woods. I called the phone Co. and they ^{knew} nothing.
I called a neighbor man and he knew nothing.

but he seen them. Different people seen them
even at Ft. Seneca - were around for several days in
this vicinity. One person told me that they were
measuring at Ft. Seneca also, and they thought
it was for the topography, as we had quite
a flood in the spring of '54. We are located along
the Sandusky river on the east side, and through
this ice jam and flood, the river cut another
course, ruining farm land on the west side of river.
I don't know why they would call on the State of
Mich., we have our own army and civil engineers,
in Ohio. I magnation and "maybe's" taking over
again. But wonder if they have anything to
do with all this - most of it has come from
the direction of the woods - might just happen
that way - but I don't have the "intestinal fortitude"
to investigate.

We have never seen any of these objects
before. My husband is very level headed and he
said right from the first it is government business,
and nothing to be alarmed about, and he issued

The object viewed by Rev [redacted] and Mrs [redacted] could possibly have been a mirage of some common object. When talking with Rev [redacted] this possibility was pointed out to him and he accepted it as a possibility.

7. It has been impossible to obtain the weather data for the area due to its being in transit to the storage depot in North Carolina. Absence of the weather data makes it impossible to determine if weather was a factor in the [redacted] sighting. This sighting will be given further consideration after the weather data has been obtained.

8. In view of the limited data, it is impossible to state definitely the cause of the sightings by Mrs [redacted]. The tone of this witness, both from her letters and the telephone conversation, indicates that she is very high strung. It is quite possible that this witness has been observing common objects under unusual conditions, and due to her distraught condition, let her imagination expand upon the illusion which resulted in her viewing the object as a possible threat.

9. AFIC does not consider this case closed, and if subsequent data reveals the probable cause your office will be immediately notified.
