SIGHTING TO END. THE OBJECT APPEARED TO GIVE ALMOST A FLASH EFFECT AFTER FIRST SIGHTING AND APPEARED TO BURN OUT. IT DID NOT FADE. ONE OBSERVER LIKENED THE BURNING TO THE RELATIVE EFFECT ON CERTAIN MISSILE NOSE CONES.
