Report of Unidentified Flying Object (Venezuela, Mr. [REDACTED])

SAFOL-3A (L/Col Tucker)

1. Mr. [REDACTED], Maracibo, Venezuela, wrote a letter to the North American Air Defense Command reporting an unidentified flying object sighting. Mr. [REDACTED] reported that he and several friends witnessed the object in Maracibo, Venezuela at 1900 on 12 November 1960.
2. Mr. [REDACTED] described the object as bright and moving NNE at a height relatively close to the earth when compared to astronomical objects.
3. It has been definitely established that the United States satellite Echo was over Venezuela at 1900 on 12 November 1960. The relative direction of motion of the satellite was the same as reported for the UFO.
4. Suggest you forward a letter to Mr. [REDACTED] informing him that the object he observed on 12 November 1960 was very probably the satellite.

Report of Unidentified Flying Object (Venezuela)

1. Reference your letter NANTD, Subject: "Report of Unidentified Flying Object," dated 13 December 1960, the information contained in the letter from Mr. [REDACTED], Maracalito, Venezuela, which you forwarded to this Center, has been evaluated. The object sighted by Mr. [REDACTED] and his friends was very probably the United States satellite Echo.
2. It has been definitely established that the passage of Echo over Venezuela on 12 November 1960 occurred at the same time as the reported unidentified object sighting.
3. Mr. [REDACTED]'s description of the object, though sketchy, is similar to descriptions of Echo received at this Center from lay witnesses. The reported direction of travel of the unidentified object matches the direction of motion of the satellite, as seen from Venezuela, at the time of the sighting.
4. Mr. [REDACTED] has been informed that the object sighted by him on 12 November 1960 was probably Echo.
