Average height of lower half of window is 62" therefore assuming the witness to be of average height the angle at which the object was observed would be very small. (The witness did not hazard a guess at the elevation angle.) Weather at time of sighting was cold, crisp, and dry with a few scattered clouds. 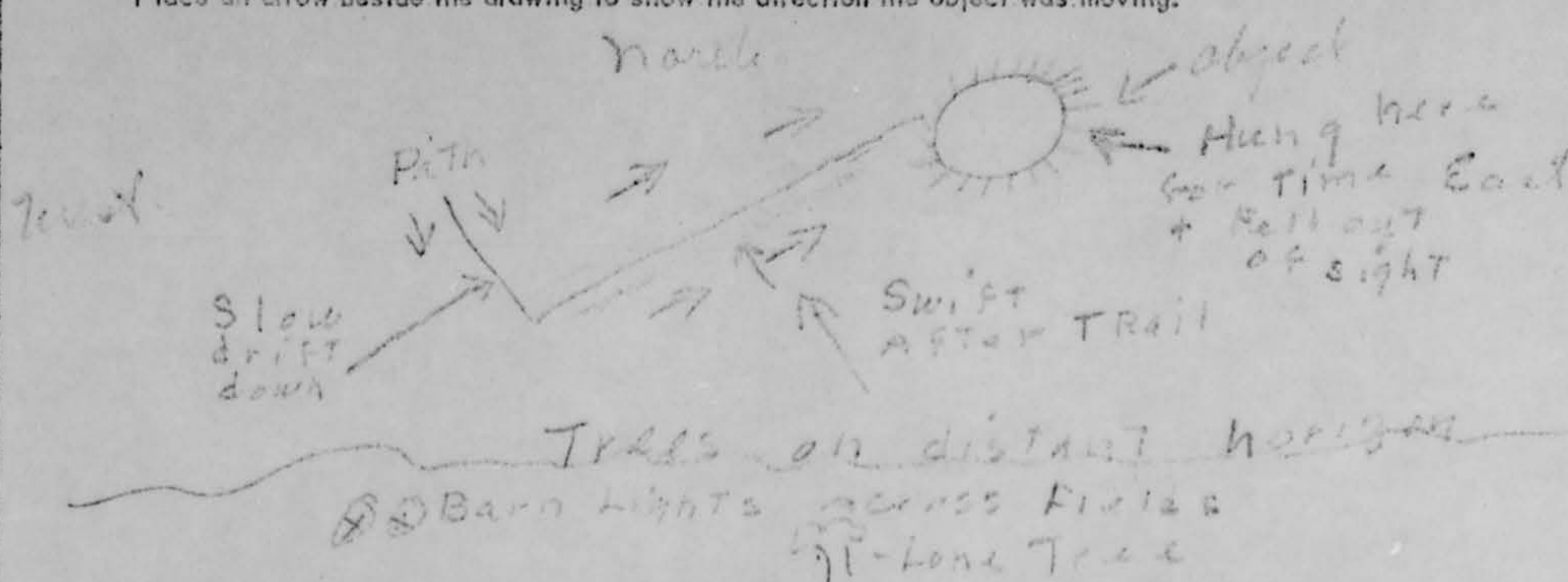

I am a metallurgical technician and have observed the needle-like nitrides in various metals, under the microscope. I was interested in the needles surrounding the circumference of this object since they appeared to be recrystallized. In a less technical method of description I keep thinking that if I had a crown like the one King Lidas wore and placed it in the sky it would give off the appearance of this object that I saw. The very brilliance of this object leads me to conclude that it had to be of great heat and was what I call in my lab, "white hot"!

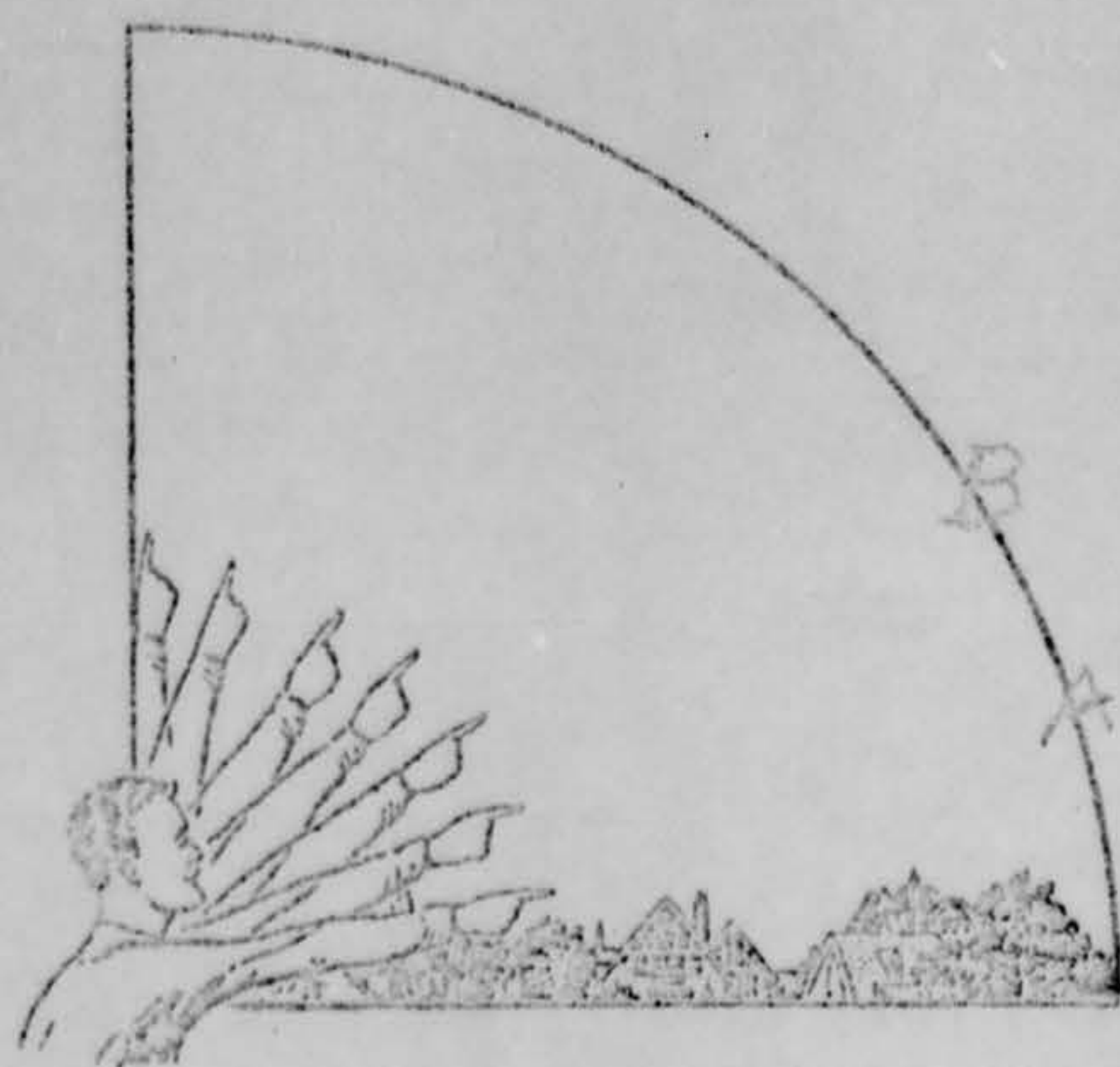

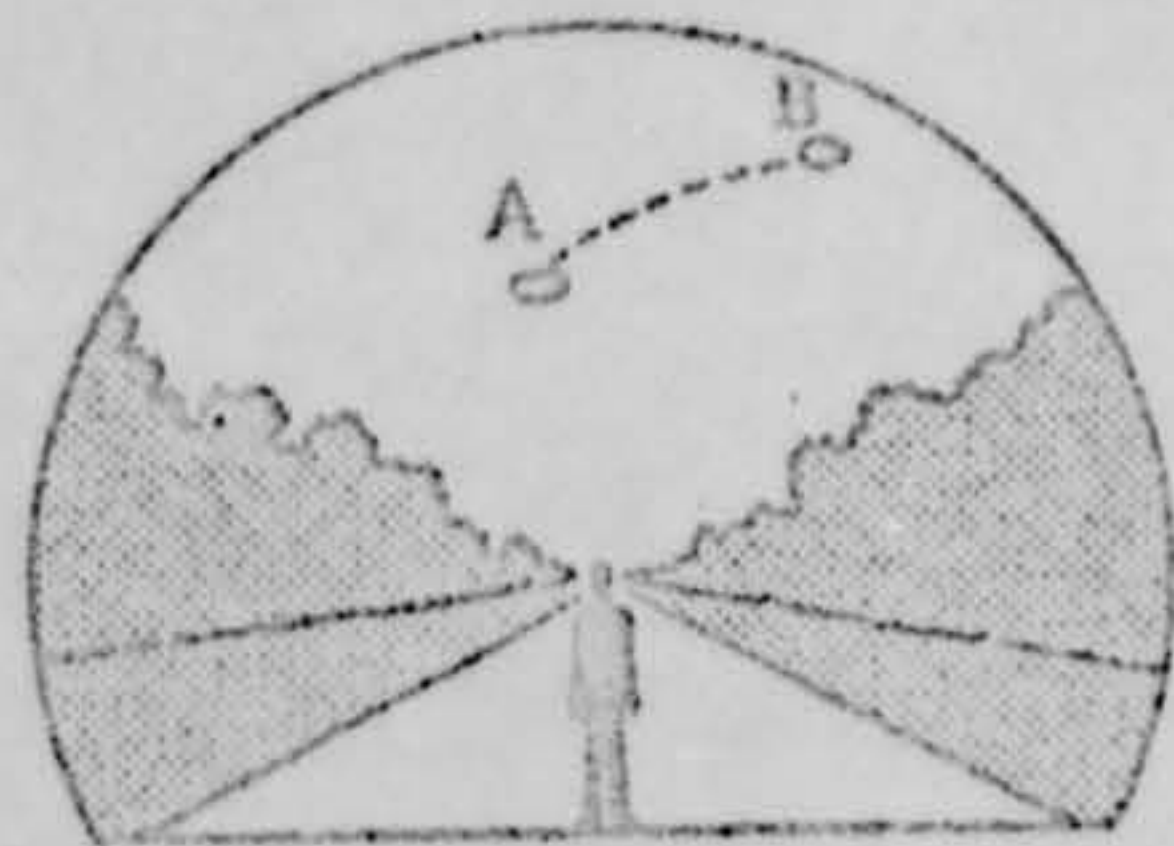
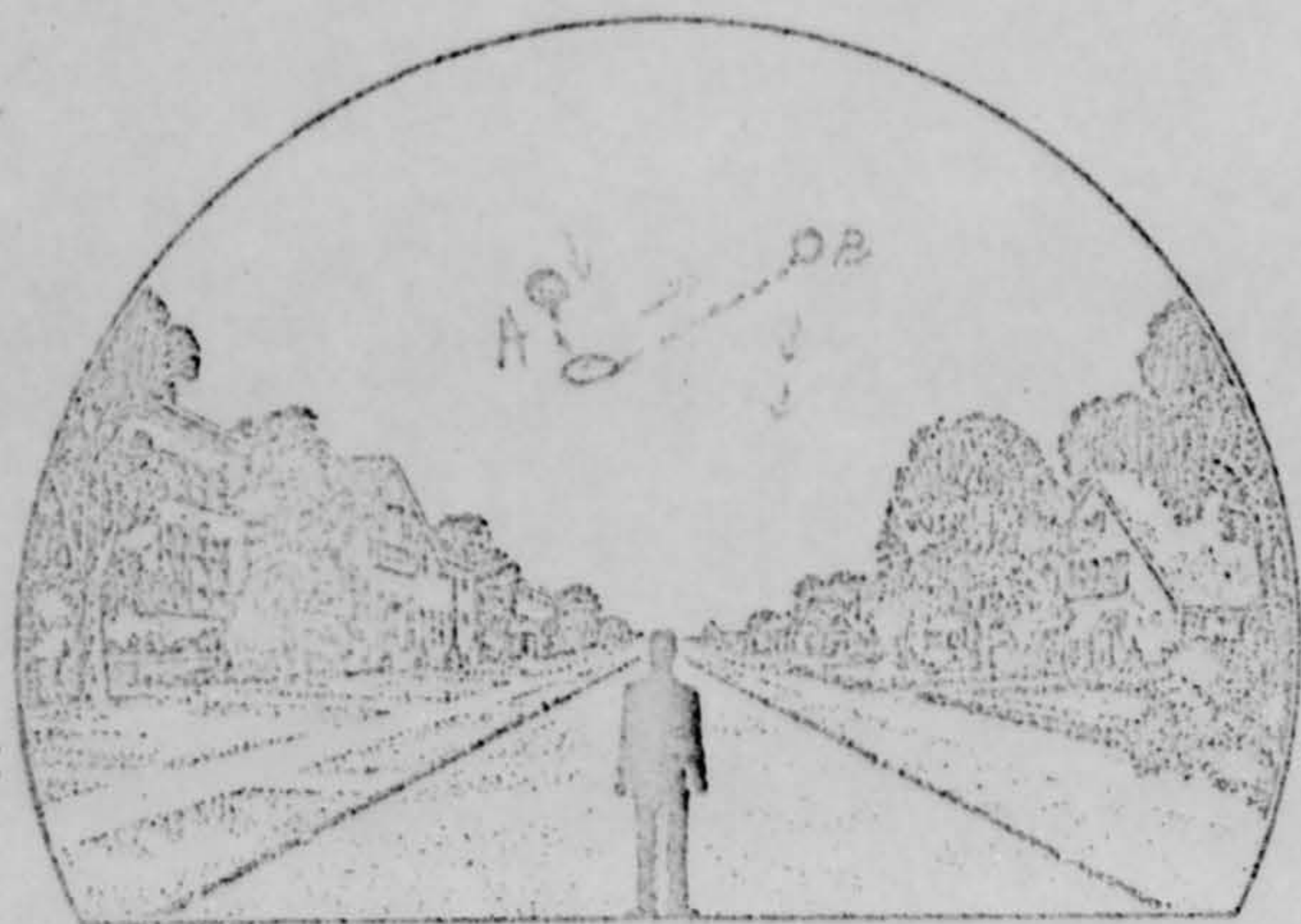

Nelson of the sighting of two objects in the same area on Jan. 9, 1961. I am pretty well convinced that the military are making some kind of radical tests and I just happened to be at the right (or wrong) place at the time they came into view. However, the two objects in the second viewing on Jan 9, 1961 were of an entirely different nature than the one described in this report.

Walking to the sink of my kitchen house on the evening of November 30, 1961 I just glanced up and out the window above my sink. Here coming out of the sky to the north was a large, brilliant object drifting slowly at a slight NE angle-I watched it for a few minutes and was startled to see it suddenly give a swish upward and eastward leaving a after trail behind it as it moved swiftly. It had needle-like crystals jutting out the full circumference of said object. It hung in the sky for a time and then slowly began a downward drift. I walked away to the phone and when I returned it was gone. Prior to going from the window however, I called my very elderly Aunt to the window just to see if she could see it. Since she has had eyesight at her age, I was interested that she saw it well. This verified my belief of its unusual brilliance.

The time was 4:50 PM. The day was Wednesday, November 30 the year of our Lord, 1960. The length of time this object was within view approximated 20 minutes.

I cannot give ^{any} further information other than mentioned in the foregoing report.

I request no publicity in this matter as I have no desire to do more than advise the military experts of this unusual object for their evaluation.

With further reference to your recent letter concerning the UFO sighting you made on 30 November 1960, there is insufficient data available at this point to allow for a valid conclusion or evaluation.

Therefore, request you fill out the inclosed technical information sheet in connection with this sighting in detail and send the completed document to the Aerospace Technical Intelligence Center, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, Attention: APCIN-4E2x.

In addition, request you answer the following questions as they apply to the sighting.

AT THE TIME OF THIS SIGHTING THE STAR CAPSULA WAS JUST RISING IN THE N.E. CAPSULA IS A RELATIVELY BRIGHT STAR, MAGNITUDE 0.2. THE WITNESS OBSERVED THE STAR THROUGH THE LOWER HALF OF A WINDOW WHILE STANDING. THE AVERAGE HEIGHT OF THE LOWER HALF OF THE WINDOW IS 62" THEREFORE ASSUMING THE WITNESS TO BE OF AVERAGE HEIGHT THE ANGLE AT WHICH THE OBJECT WAS OBSERVED WOULD BE VERY SMALL. (THE WITNESS DID NOT MAKE A GUESS AS TO THE ELEVATION ANGLE). THE WEATHER AT THE TIME, AS REPORTED BY THE WITNESS, WAS COLD, CRISP AND DRY WITH A FEW SCATTERED CLOUDS. THE DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT AND ITS MOVING FIT THOSE WHICH ARE CHARACTERISTIC OF REFRACTED OBJECTS. IT IS CONCLUDED THAT THE OBJECT VIEWED

BY MRS [REDACTED] AND MISS [REDACTED] WAS PREVIOUSLY
A REFRACTED IMAGE OF THE STAR CAPSULE.

Dear Senator Jackson:

I am approaching you with the following report because I am not certain whom I should advise. It may have some importance.

I live 11 miles south of Everett and my home is on a slight hill. The northern sky is visible from my kitchen windows and Pease Field is north and west of the house.

(Nov. 30) On Wednesday evening about 5:00 PM I walked to the sink to start my evening meal and glanced out the window to observe a startling object of tremendous brilliance in the northern sky. It was of almost incredible size and was moving to the west with a slight drift downward.

I watched it with some degree of awe and it suddenly, with an almost wish-like movement lifted and moved in an easterly direction and then seemed to hang in the sky and sparkled with a great light. The needles shooting out from its entire circumference were just that, sharp and of a crystal appearance. (Apparently rays of some type.)

I hurried to the phone and called the Times in Seattle and a bored man on the city desk took my words and remarked, "we have had no report" and I, in impatience replied, "well, you are getting one now". It would not have mattered anyway for when I returned to the window the object was gone!

My very elderly Aunt who lives with me and is nearly 89 years old is losing her eyesight and cannot see too well. I called her to the window and was very interested in her being able to see this object clearly. I mention this only to call attention to the very great brilliance this object had.

I said nothing more about this matter and waited for news reports to see if anyone else had noticed it and what had taken place in the world of satellites. I was not surprised to have Chet Huntley and other news men report this Russian satellite as having disappeared, etc.

I am and was convinced that I would hear of something unusual and I am convinced that this object I observed was related in some manner with out-of-the-ordinary activity. It was much too spectacular in size, brilliance and behavior to be anything of an ordinary nature!

I suggest that you handle this information in the manner necessary to the proper people. I have been bothered that I should have written sooner and am of the opinion that this object is of significant importance. I will leave that up to your judgement. I am reluctant to have any publicity regarding this, but would be glad to show anyone quietly, where and how I saw it.

With further reference to your recent letter concerning the UFO sighting you made on 30 November 1960, there is insufficient data available at this point to allow for a valid conclusion or evaluation.

Therefore, request you fill out the inclosed technical information sheet in connection with this sighting in detail and send the completed document to the Aerospace Technical Intelligence Center, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, Attention: AFCIN-4E2x.

In addition, request you answer the following questions as they apply to the sighting.

- a. Was the object viewed through the upper or lower half of the window?
- b. What is the approximate height of the window above the floor?
- c. What is the approximate vertical length of the window?
- d. How far were you from the window when you saw the object?
- e. Did you move closer to the window while viewing the object?
- f. Was the window covered by frost or any other moisture?
- g. Are there any telephone or electric lines which can be seen through your kitchen window? If so, are any of the poles nearby?
- h. Are there any trees outside of your kitchen window?
- i. If there are trees, was the object seen above, below, or through them?
- j. Did your area experience snow or freezing rain earlier on the day of the sighting?
- k. Were there icicles on the trees the day of the sighting?

- m. What is the general description of your house? (A photo, if possible, is desired.)
