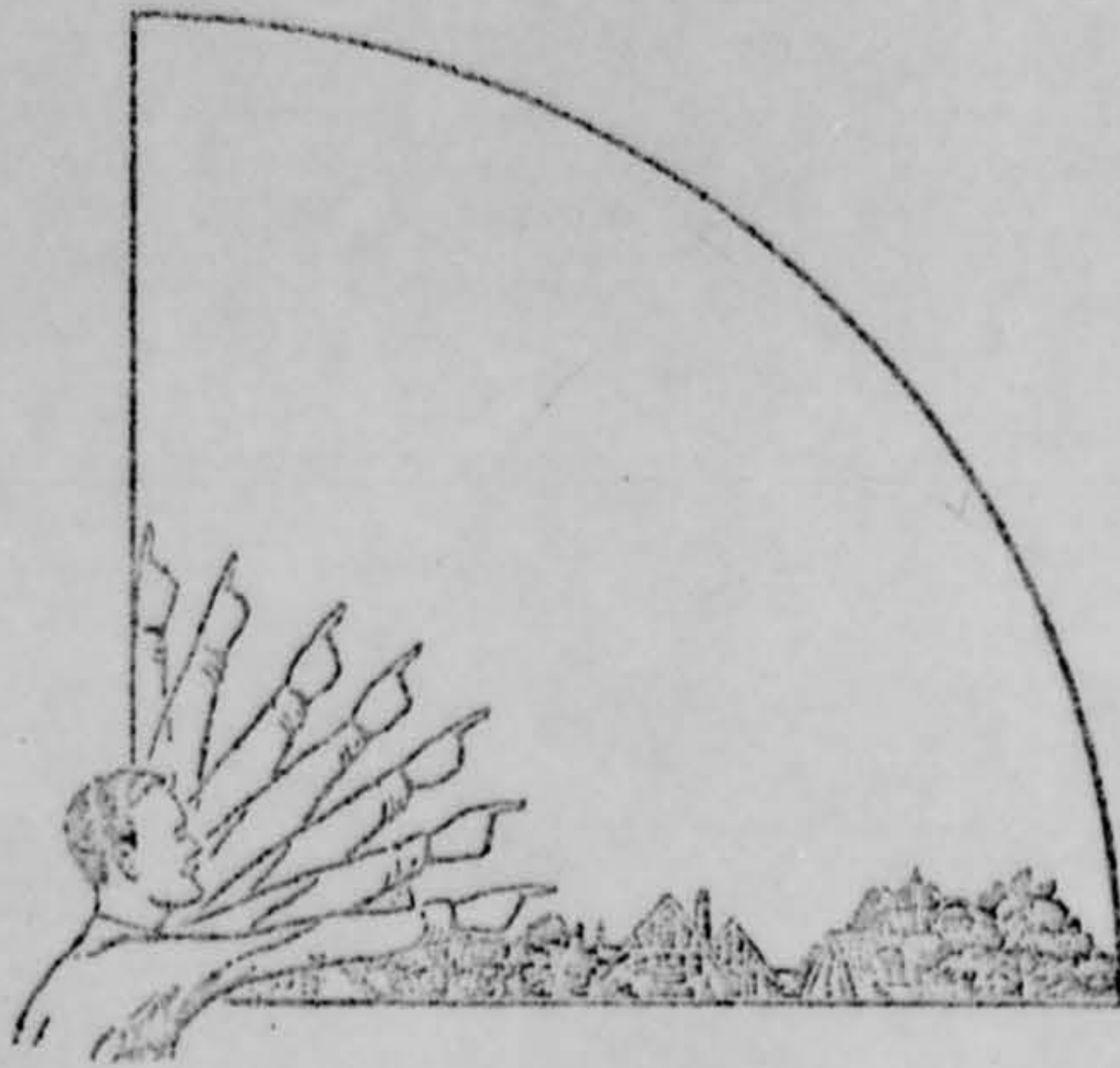

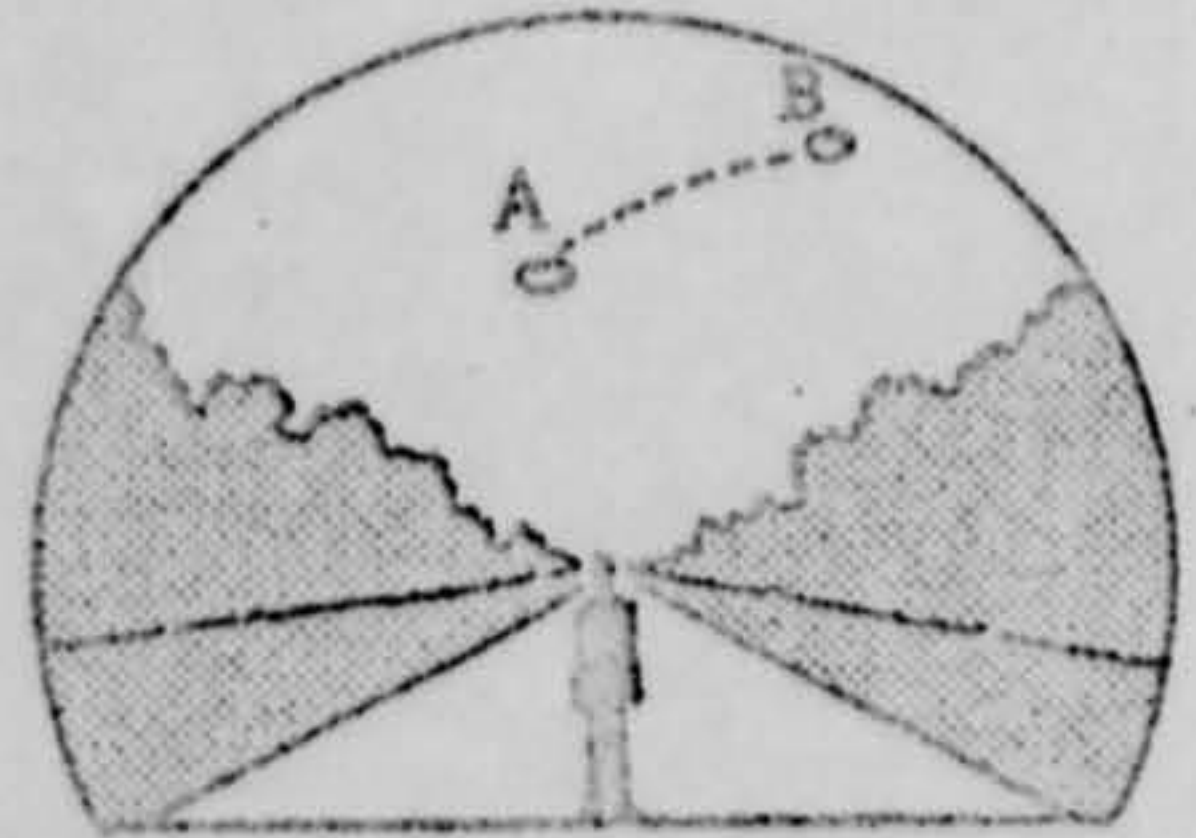
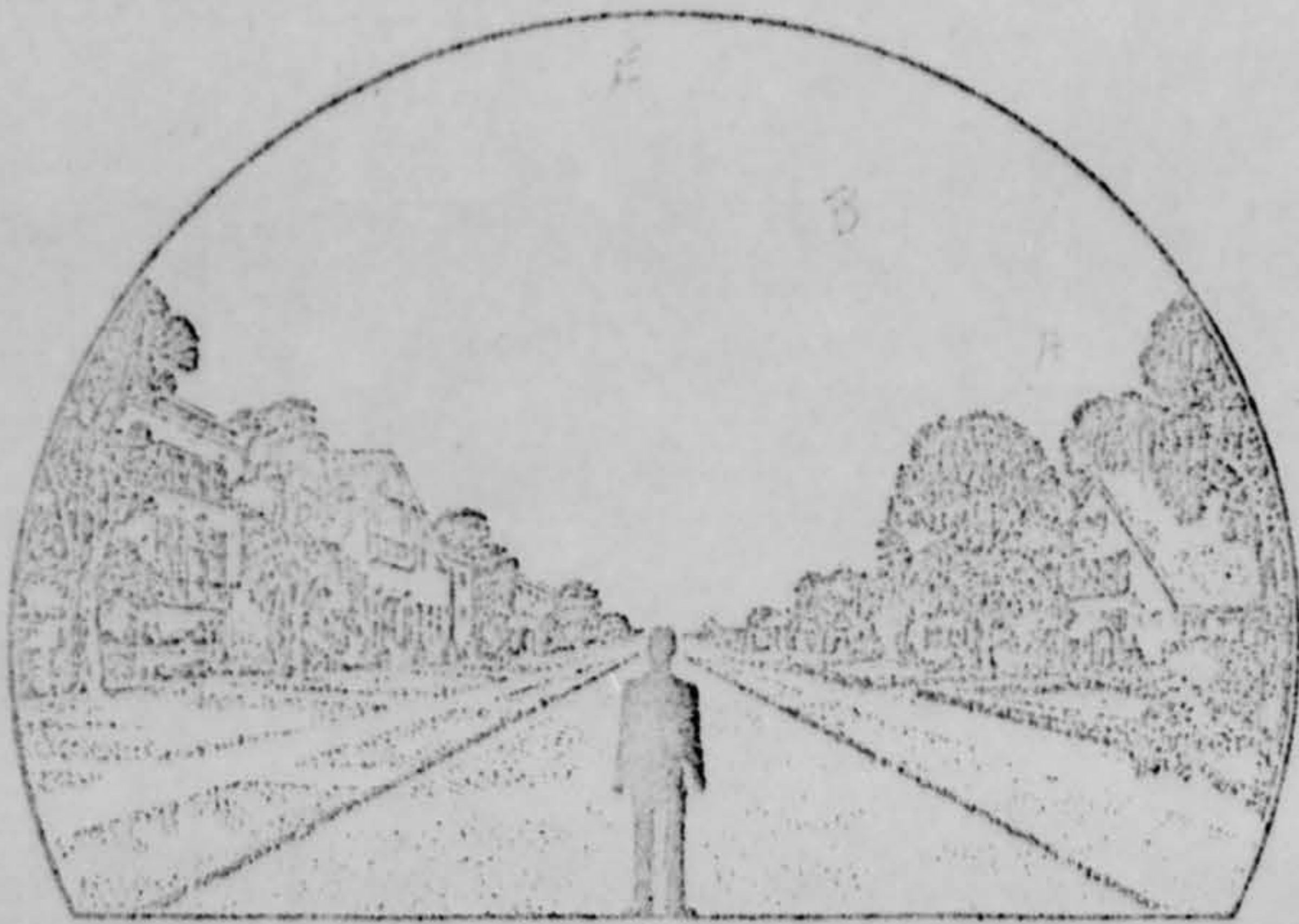

10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Looked like a moon, full and the same color as a newly risen harvest moon. Faded out and reappeared once. Seemed to grow dimmer and dimmer as it faded out. Then when it reappeared it grew larger and larger until it was the size of the moon, then it grew progressively smaller until it disappeared.		11. COMMENTS Size of the object was reported to be that of the moon. It is possible that there was a low hanging cloud which was reflecting lights from the ground. There was no other report of anything unusual from this area, and certainly if there were anything unusual in the area it would have been seen by many people, especially during the early evening hours. The alternate appearance and disappearance of the object was probably due to the cloud slowly moving to the E with the usually prevailing westerly winds.

My husband saw it first, and called me out to look at it. It looked like a moon, but the color of the newly risen harvest moon it was fading out when I got out doors and my husband & I stood looking at the sky when I had been while he was explaining how it looked, when it started to glow again, only it was 20 to 30 feet further to the East. Gradually the color got deeper & darker, but through the center remained the same, a bright glow spread all around it until it was 6 to 8 ft. in diameter, then gradually got smaller to the size of a small object, the color got a grayish tint, then was a white (or light) and disappeared.

As he started back into the house he glanced up into the sky wondering what the weather would be like the following day. He saw a large round flame colored object, which seemed to flare out and then disappear he came into the house and called me to look at it. When I got out it was gone and he tried to point out to me just where it had been. We were both looking at the sky while he was explaining when all of a sudden it appeared again only this time it was further East by N.E. It appeared just like a harvest moon about the same



size and flame colour. While we watched  
 it flared out all around it until it  
 was about 5 times as big, then a freighter,  
 then gradually returned to the size of
