

Attached are the photographs described in the UFO Report submitted from this station, 7 January 1961. Subject of the attached photographs was later determined to be the planet Venus as seen through a haze (Reference UFO Report from this station, dated 10 Jan 61). The camera was aimed and focused upon the planet and the photographs were taken at approximately 1930 hours. No artificial light was in the area, with the exception of a flashlight being used by the photographer to assist him in making proper lens and shutter settings. The source of the objects appearing in the photos is undetermined, unless it resulted from improper film exposure or mechanical failure of the camera. The sky was clear with the exception of a light haze and some broken clouds at approximately 10,000 feet. Such clouds did not inhibit the viewing of the object. The ground was snow covered, and the temperature was approximately 10° Fahrenheit above zero.

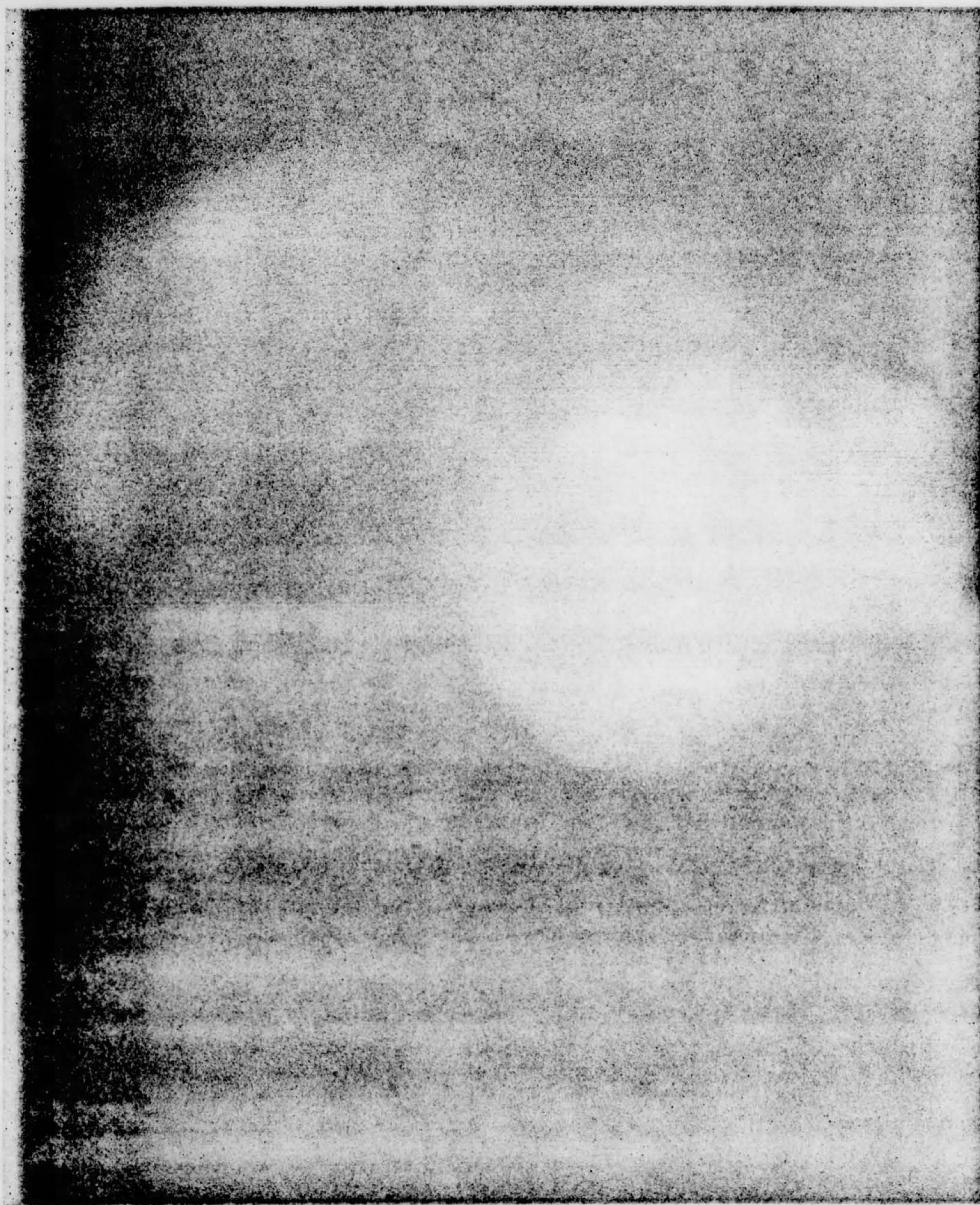

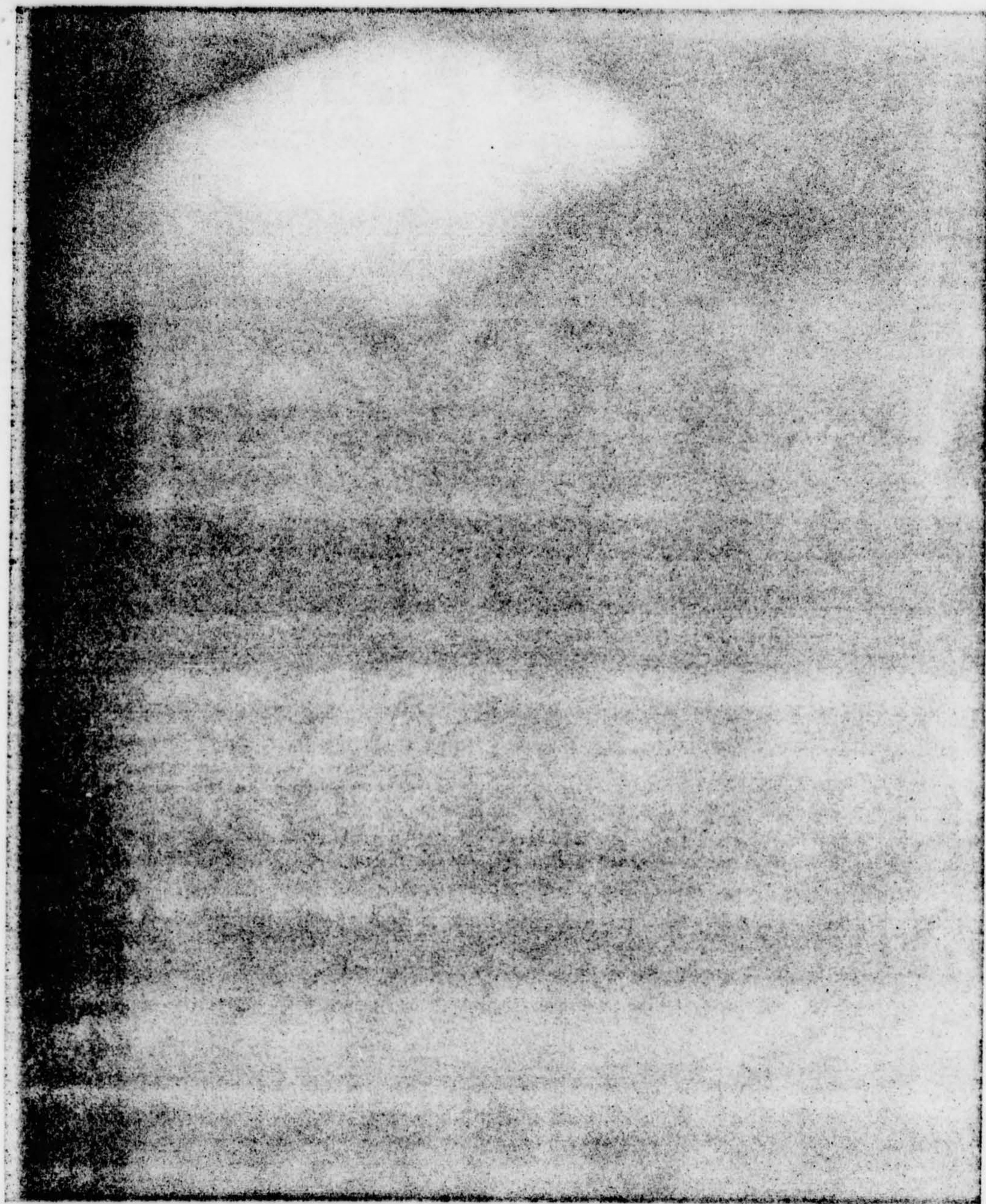
