.....A sighting "flap" in Maine last February 7th and 8th included several fairly detailed descriptions. One of the best reports came from a man who was driving on the Maine Turnpike at 2:40 a.m. on February 9th. He became aware of a "terrible brilliance" which lit up the whole upper left hand corner of the windshield. As he watched in amazement, a spherical-shaped object - brilliant pea green and somewhat bluish - moved across the sky from northwest to northeast. He said it was ten times brighter than a shooting star and was trailed by a cone-shaped tail of sparks. There was a brilliant flash of light almost like an explosion as the object disappeared below the horizon.

In fact, he states that he did not report it at the time because he did not wish to appear to be a "crackpot." This report, aside from the time factor, agrees very well with our cited report. Mr. [redacted] states that he did not check the time but that it was close to dawn as the sky was already lightening in the east.
