ALTHOUGH THIS SEEMS TO BE THE MOST ACCURATE OF ANY HEARD. THE 25TH  
ADIV SAGE ADC IS SENDING MESSAGES CONCERNING THOSE REPORTS.  
PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS WOULD INDICATE EITHER THE REENTRY OF A SPACE  
VEHICLE OR A METEOR. HOWEVER, THE FACTS THAT THE WEATHERMAN ADVISES  
THAT THERE WERE NO CONTRAIL LEVELS, THE REPORTED INITIAL BURST AND  
ESPECIALLY THE DEFINATE INTERRUPTION OF THE WHITE STREAM, WOULD SEEM  
TO POINT TO A SPACE VEHICLE.

OTHER REPORTS CORRELATED WITH THIS ONE BY TIME AND, TO SOME EXTENT  
BU TEXT , SEEM TO PLACE THE FALL SOMEWHERE NEAR KELLOG, IDAHO
