STATES THAT IT WAS AT A TREMENDOUS HEIGHT, HAD A PULSATING ORANGE FLAME

AND A FOLLOWING CONTRAIL LIKE APPENDAGE WHICH SEEMED TO EVAPORATE

AS SOON AS IT WAS GENERATED. HE FEELS POSITIVE THAT THE PULSATING FLAME
