PART II: 1. COPILOT LT M.J. MICHAUD WHO INITIALLY REPORTED UFO IS ON LEAVE AT PRESENT AND IS NOT EXPECTED BACK UNTIL 21-23 MAY. AIRCRAFT COMMANDER WAS QUESTIONED ON AZIMUTH OF OBJECT AND STATED THAT COPILOT HAD SAID THAT IT WAS AT APPROXIMATELY 32 TO 33 DEGREES IN ELEVATION AND DISAPPEARED BELOW HORIZON. 2. QUERY OF LOCAL WEATHER STATION INDICATES THAT NO WEATHER BALLONS WERE IN AREA AT TIME OF EITHER SIGHTING.
