(B) (1) OBJECT FIRST OBSERVED THRU A THEODOLITE BY A MR.

~~REDACTED~~ A WEATHERMAN STATIONED AT THE MERCURY TEST SITE (AEC) NEV., AT APPROXIMATELY 1600 HRS ZEBRA 3 JUNE 1961. OBJECT ARRIVED FROM SOUTH, ORBITED AREA TURNING SLOWLY 90 DEGREES TO WEST AND DISAPPEARED AT APPROXIMATELY 1830Z HEADING WEST.

(2) OBSERVER ESTIMATED OBJECT TO BE 80-120,000 FOOT ALTITUDE.

(3) OBJECT HELD ALTITUDE THROUGHOUT SIGHTING, DISAPPEARING APPROXIMATELY OVER LATHROP WELLS, NEVADA.

(4) FLIGHT PATH FROM SOUTH, TURNING WEST 90 DEGREES OVER AEC MERCURY TEST SIGHT, DISAPPEARING IN WEST.

(J) NO BALLOON RELEASE IN AREA TO CREDIT AS UFO. FAA ADVISED NO SCHEDULED FLYING ACTIVITIES WILL ACCOUNT FOR SIGHTING. HEAVY MILITARY FLYING ACTIVITY IN APPROXIMATE AREA OF SIGHTING ACCOUNTED FOR BY 865TH AC&W SQ CANNOT BE ATTRIBUTED TO UFO.
