10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Object like 3/4 moon, size of a half-dollar orange in color. No motion. Object would diminish in size to disappearing point over a five minute period and then rapidly regain it's large size. Repeated cycle during entire observation of 3 1/2 hours.		11. COMMENTS The witnesses were at a drive-in theater and there was no other report of the object. The object remained in one position throughout the sighting. The reporting officers indicate that the object's location was on an azimuth that would place the object over Westover AFB. There were high thin cirrus clouds at the time, plus a temperature inversion from 8-9,000 ft. A SHINY light from an unknown source was probably reflecting off the inversion layer rather than the clouds, since it did not move. Case is evaluated as a reflection from this inversion.
