B. DESCRIPTION OF XOURSE OF OBJECT(S).

(1) SEARCHING FOR F106 MAKING A PASS ON OUR AIRCRAFT, I PICKED UP MOVEMENT OF HIGH FLYING, HIGH SPEED OBJECT. SECOND SIGHTING APPROXIMATELY FOUR TO FIVE MINUTES LATER, OBJECT WAS A BLUR PASSING OVERHEAD.

(2) & (3): FIRST SIGHTING, AIRCRAFT WAS ON A HEADING OF 40 DEGREES MAG HEADING WHEN OBJECT APPEARED AT 80 DEGREES ELEVATION- 30 DEGREES MAG HEADING OBJECT PASSED OVERHEAD DISAPPEARING AT 70 DEGREES ELÉVATION- 55 DEGRES MAG HEADING. SCOND SIGHTING, AIRCRAFT WAS ON A HEADING OF 40 DEGREES MAG HEADING OBJECT APPEARED DIRECTLY ABOVE AT 85 DEGREES ELEVATION AND PASSD OUT OF SIGHT AT 35 DEGREES MAG HEADING.

(4) OBJECT APPEARED TO HAVE A DEFINITE STRAIGHT FLIGHT PATH. THERE WERE NO MANEUVERS.

(5) VERY RAPIBLY AS OUTLINED IN 2 AND 3 ABOVE.

(6) FIRST SIGHTING- TWO TO THRE SECONDS. SECOND SIGHTING- JUST A BLUR.
