

j. Checked with Goodfellow, AFB, SAN ANGELO, Texas and were informed that no balloons were released by them - also asked local weather authorities and were informed no balloons were released.

k. This reported sighting is one of the most accurate we have received as the civilian reporting the sighting was interrogated by SSgt Thomas A. Williams, 703rd AC&W Sqd., Texarkana, Texas, who followed the format contained in Paragraph 15, AFR 200-2. Since Mr. ██████████ had been questioned by Sgt Williams using the check list I felt it unnecessary to contact Mr. ██████████ again. We contacted Goodfellow AFB, San Angelo and they reported it could not be one of their balloons as they haven't had one up in a week. I also contacted the FAA on base and they in turn contacted both Fort Worth and Memphis and they also had nothing to report. No picture was taken nor is there any physical evidence.

After preliminary analysis it is the opinion of the preparing officer that since numerous reported sightings in this area in the past have been weather balloons this sighting was also some type of balloon.
