TO BE THE SIZE OF AND SIMILAR TO A PING PONG BALL WITH SMALL WINGS.

THE OBJECT WAS HOVERING WHEN FIRST SEEN AND CONTINUED TO HOVER  
UNTIL IT WENT INTO A RAPID CLIMB AT THE END OF THE 45 MINUTE  
OBSERVATION PERIOD. WITNESS ESTIMATED ALTITUDE BY COMPARING IT  
WITH THE JET AIRCRAFT WHICH SHE ESTIMATED AT 32,000 FEET. AS  
HER REFERENCE POINT, THE JET, HAD GONE AT THE TIME THE OBJECT  
DISAPPEARED THERE WAS NO ESTIMATE OF THE ALTITUDE OF THE OBJECT  
THEN EXCEPT THAT IT CLIMBED EXTREMELY HIGH.
