1. Reference the attached copy of a letter to General Bernard Schriever from Mr. ██████████ requesting information on a UFO sighted by the writer. Mr. ██████████ letter does not contain sufficient information to allow a reliable conclusion. It is suggested that a questionnaire, FTD Form #164, July 1961, be forwarded to Mr. ██████████ with instructions for him to complete and return it directly to the Foreign Technology Division.

2. In addition to the questions on the form, it is desirable that Mr. ██████████ provide answers to the following:

- a. How was the 25 second time duration determined?
- b. Was the duration the same for all sightings?
- c. What was the approximate number of times the object was observed to flash?

3. It is suggested that you inform Mr. ██████████ that factors such as altitude of the aircraft, wind direction, direction in which the aircraft is moving, temperature, humidity, cloud cover, background noise, etc., have bearing on whether or not noise from an aircraft can be heard and that satellites cross specific parallels of latitude at the same angle when moving South to North and the supplement of that angle when moving North to South. Any object which crosses a given parallel at angles that are not supplementary is not a satellite.
