





Objts were not observed during exposure, only after film was processed. There have been several photographs submitted for analysis which are supposedly UFO's. In every case where objts were not observed until after film processing, objts turned out to be a reflection unseen by photographer of damaged emulsion fm being scratched, or foreign material adhering to emulsion during processing.



c. Photo Nr. 4; on this photograph the white images are sharp while the rest of the photograph is out of focus. No corresponding images can be seen on the negative, and the white objects must have been caused by the presence of foreign matter during the printing process.

2. The unidentified objects are the result of poor quality photo laboratory work.



corner of films when in the process
of drying in dark room.

The object seems
to be hovering in the direction of Ft.
Jay coming from Ellis Island &
directly pointing itself at the Island.

Circled object on Print are unde-
termined, but bright & do not look
like cloud formations. Notice the
^{ship} picture was taken toward the
Sunlight (above left). 3 exposures
were taken off Circle Line to
Statue of Liberty between 11³⁰
& 11⁴⁵. Negative I forwarded to
you was approx. at 11⁵³^{AM} or 12¹⁰^{PM}
other shots from ^{100th Weyman} Balcony of Statue of
Liberty 10 flights up. at 1³⁰^{PM} - 1⁴⁵^{PM}
or 2⁰⁰^{PM} the latest.
