Dear Sir:

I have written you two times previously for information on U.F.O.'s. But until September 16, I never expected to see one.

At 8:30 P.M. we were in the back yard star gazing when we heard a sound like an airplane, hoping to see it in my telescope we scanned the sky, we heard it get louder and then get fainter once more we scanned the sky this time we saw a stationary, blinking, red object about 35° above the horizon in the telescope it appeared to be a white and round. We had watched it for about 3 minutes when it disappeared. About 15 seconds later it reappeared about 10° lower in the sky. It began to move N.W. then vanished.

We immediately decided it was not an airplane because it was stationary and moved 10 degrees in 15 seconds. You may think this is a hoax but I don't care what you think because it's true. Would you please analyze it even though you may think it is a hoax and send me the result.
