10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Fall rapidly to earth at about a 40-50° angle and burned brightly. Seemed to be operating mechanically, spouting flames and lighting up brilliantly every few seconds, as a mechanism emitting at regular intervals. Seemed to be alive rather than falling as a star.		11. COMMENTS Witness does not state how long objt was in view, but her report indicates that it was in view longer than duration of a meteor. It is quite possible that objt was a flare. It has been previously reported that there has been instances where flares have been sent up attached to balloons which were subsequently reported as UFO's. It is therefore concluded that objt was probably a flare.

Dear Mr. Secretary:

Because I realize that there may be some small value to be gained from transmitting, please be good enough to see that this letter reaches the proper individual.

At about three-fifteen last Friday morning, September 19th, I was startled to see what appeared to be a large falling star. This object was falling rapidly to earth at about a forty to fifty degree angle and was burning brightly.

As I watched my interest and alertness increased because the object surely was not a normal falling star I had ever observed. Then I realized that it seemed to be of a fire-like quality, something like lightning or brilliant electric sparks, the luminous emitting at regular intervals. It also seemed to be flying at the rate of about a mile per second, a little faster than lightning.

I could not tell the exact time of sight because of the brilliancy of the object but as it fell down towards here. From the first instant, I first thought it might be a meteorite shot, it went through the air so easily, however, I was not sure if it was a meteorite or not. I could not tell if it had been burned up in the air. The object was about forty to fifty feet above the ground, I could not look it up, because it was burning and it was in about a half mile away.

I want that this has been a mere tale and would appreciate knowing whether or not there is any value to you of such a recording. Also is it possible that this object was still in the messages at Washington?
