10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Elevations and azimuths of planet Venus at times of sightings from Indian Spring and Nellis AFB are coincident with those reported for UFO. Planet was of magnitude -1 and its appearance in a theodolite would have been as described by witnesses. Since it was reported that witness came across planet while tracking a weather balloon it is safe to assume balloon was at an angle to that reported for objt. Objt observed by radar was in SE and was probably weather balloon. Analysis and Conclusions:

Rained white meteors looking object with silver sheen. Appearance is one object breaking into 4. OBSERVATION BY WEATHER OBSERVER FOLLOWING PILOT. SPOTTED AT 0904. STILL VISIBLE AT 1000. 160° AZ 62° ELEV. → 180° AZ 63° ELEV. SPEED 6 KNOTS. PICKED ON RADAR AS 3C REFLCS STB. ON SCOPE FOR 45 MIN ON AZ SCOPE ONLY

THE ELEVATIONS AND AZIMUTHS OF THE PLANET VENUS AT THE TIMES OF THE SIGHTINGS FROM INDIAN SPRINGS AFB AND NECESS AFB ARE CONCIDENT WITH THOSE REPORTED FOR THE UFO. THE PLANET WAS OF ~~—~~ MAGNITUDE -3.4 AND ITS APPEARANCE IN A TACOOLITE WOULD HAVE BEEN AS DESCRIBED BY THE WITNESSES. SINCE IT

WAS REPORTED IN THE SKY ACROSS THE PLANET WHILE TRACKING A WX BALLOON IT IS SAFE TO ASSUME THE BALLOON WAS AT AN AZIMUTH CLOSE TO THAT REPORTED FOR THE OBJECT. THE OBJECT OBSERVED BY THE RADAR WAS IN THE SE AND WAS PROBABLY THE WX BALLOON.

THERE IS NO EVIDENCE AVAILABLE WHICH WOULD INDICATE THAT THE OBJECT SEEN VISUALLY AND THE OBJECT OBSERVED ON RADAR WERE NOT VENUS AND A WX BALLOON.
