COMMENTS Objt responsible for this sight-ing was probably a meteor. Description of objt matches that of a classic meteor. Green color reported by witness is usually associated with that class of meteors known as fireballs. Fact that more than 1 objt was reported is probably due to meteor breaking up & just prior to burnout. There is no evidence available indicating objt was anything other than a meteor.


The accompanying sketch is, to the best of my artistic ability, what [REDACTED], a sophomore at N.C. State College, a student from Campbell College and I saw in the sky.

We were observing Jupiter in my Telescope - we looked in the direction of Pleadies for another possible Telescope object when this object appeared in our view from above a tree about  $30^{\circ}$  to the vertical - moving very nearly south - where it went out of view over trees - about  $60^{\circ}$  to the vertical - Time elapsed about three or four seconds -

The air was very clear - No Moon - no clouds in any direction, Temperature about  $60^{\circ}$  - very comfortable for staying out with the telescope - time around 10:00 P.M., 17 Nov 61, we could see clearly the outline of a plane that passed about 20 minutes later -

We could not see any outline of my object - only the lights. They were in the center of the lighted area (see sketch) and appeared as if they were shining through translucent glass - all three were the same color - greenish yellow - Absolutely No Sound accompanied this phenomenon - they seemed to move as a unit - [REDACTED]
