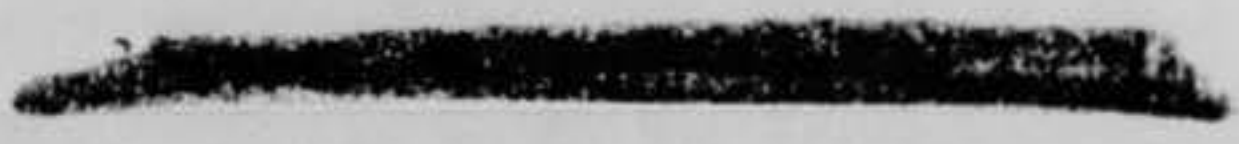

Gentlemen:

The recent report to you of two unidentified flying objects on December 28th at Fairfax level air station has prompted me to write and tell you of my experience.

In 1962 I was living in Morgantown, West Virginia and teaching at Grafton High School in Grafton, West Virginia. One night at approximately 6:00 p.m. in either January or February I and my wife and I were on our way to the Grafton-Elkins basketball game in Grafton. We were approximately 10 miles from our home when I saw five flying objects. I said to my wife "Lary look at the sky". They were disappearing at the end of the horizon as she looked up and saw them. When I first saw them they were at the other end of the horizon. She both has identical descriptions of the objects.
