The recent report of two unidentified flying objects on
February 26 at Picturesque visibility was prompt me to
write in view of my experience.


I am 36 years living in Morgantown, West Virginia and teaching
[REDACTED] at Grafton High School in Grafton, West
Virginia. At approximately 6 p.m. in either January
or February, I and my wife and I were on our way to the Grafton-
Elkins basketball game. We were walking westward from
from our home when I saw two flying objects. One is described
"Mary went to the city". They were disappearing at the end of the
horizon as far as I can see when I first saw them they
were at the other end of the horizon. Both has identical
descriptions of the objects.

They were circular, dark green at the center and became lighter green toward the edges. There was a yellow glow around the objects that had a spin off affect that indicated the objects were turning at a high rate of speed. The objects were moving at a tremendous rate of speed and in a formation. Following is a diagram of the formation.
