The Blackburn Evening Telegraph carried the following report in its issue of April 27: "A flying saucer, a comet, a shooting star, a satellite?—Mr. Clarence Standen, of King Street, Whalley, is still wondering just what it was he and neighbours saw flying over Whalley on Wednesday night (April 25).

"Describing the object, Mr. Standen said, 'It was round, it was extremely bright and it kept changing colour to red and then back to white. We were watching television. I just happened to look out of the window and there it was. I ran upstairs and got the glasses on it. Even then, I could not make out what it was. I went next door and my neighbours looked at it. They were as mystified as I was. Altogether we watched it for three-quarters of an hour. I can only think that it was one of the many satellites that are in orbit.'

"Mr. Standen added, 'One of the first things I did was to ring Stonyhurst College to see whether the observatory there had seen it. But everybody was on holiday.'"

Italy-April 27, 1962-An American family living in Milan reported that they had seen a "flying saucer" about 400 metres above their home, moving at great speed on headed NW. The round saucer was topped by a glowing red dom. It was seen by at least four persons for a full minute.
