# Green Flash Over Cincinnati

On May 3, 1962, at 8 p.m. a bright treenish-white flash spread across the mushern Cincinnati sky. Reports generally agreed its light was visible for three to 10 seconds, that the object or light had a luminous tail and traveled horicentaily toward the southwest. The object, described by witnesses as "rocketchaped," "a soft bine puff," huge infront, skinny at the end" and "a huge ball of fire with a tail, sort of greenish." ne "no particular shape," was at an elevation of 30 degrees in the south, traveling from southeast to southwest. Although the object was explained as a possible "meteor," the Cincinnati Enquirer noted that no one had a ready explanation at the time of the sighting. Reports also came from Wheeling, W. Va., and Columbus and Dayton, Ohio airports also received reports.

## Another convert

The Newcastle Journal on May reported how a disbeliever in long saucers was confronted in evidence that he could no orger ispore. The account read stoilows:

Could yesterday, Mr. John Carr did not believe in flying accers. Now he's not so sure. his doubts began in the small lours of yesterday morning when a was getting ready for hed at his home in Deanham Cardens, renham, Newcastle.

Mr. Carr, in 26-year-old salesnon, boked out of the bedroom indow towards Westerhope and large bright object which peared to come close and then ove surey. Thinking he was being things, he roused his ounger brother. 18-year-old

Mr. Carr told the Journal; Colin saw it, too, and we still can't depute it out. I don't believe it diving sancers and am prepared to accept any fogical explanation for it, but none is forthcoming.

When I tell people of what have seen they begin to tell me, in a fool, then I tell them my brother also saw it and they beared their minds. He thinks that it could not have been an eruplane because of the overcast ky. It grew larger while he and his brother watched, then disappeared. I don't want people to

hink I'm cranky. I would like to know if anyone else saw something similar. I have ridiculed hese stories of flying sancers in the past, Now, well, I just don't know.

TOKUSHIMA-KEN, JAPAN-May 10,1962. A 20-yr old farmer saw three orange-glowing objects which approached at a speed less than ordinary aircraft speed from SE to NW. They were crescent-shaped and glowing a very brilliant orange. The objects were about the size of a dodgeball. No sound or trail. Duration 3 min. (Note similarity to recent Hawaiian sighting.)

Previously a May 12, 1962 report of four similiar looking objects, looking like aluminum-colored round-topped circular saucers were seen and reported to me, as they moved slowly north near a transport plane leaving Hanscom Air Force Base. In all three of these New England sightings the mystery objects were seen under good weather conditions and showed good clear edges. The description (parachute-shaped) in almost a half-dozen sightings near the vicinity of Hanscom Air Force Base was repeated time and time again.

Upon contacting Hanscom Field authorities there stated that there had been no sightings of 'flying saucers' or UFOs over or near Hanscom in recent weeks.

Either the eyewitnesses didn't report their sightings to the Larry Air Force for fear of ridicule or due to censorship orders, or Henscom Air Force officials were unable to see these objects reported by so many other people, which is highly doubtful

May 12-Boston Patent Lawyer Robert K. Randall reported four parachute shaped, aluminum-colored, round objects near a transport plane leaving Hanscom Field near Lexington, Mass.
