Some viewers estimating it at 200' long, was shaped like a ball and had a long tail or trail. Tail appeared to be burning and pieces falling from the object.		11. COMMENTS This object possesses the characteristics outlined for that class of meteor known as a fireball. Re-entries of artificial satellites would produce the same general type display, but no re-entry occurred on this date. Dr. R. M. Tepeetre, Dominion Astrophysical observatory reported the object to be a meteor.

"Meteor" Panics Baseball Crowd

Another one of those huge, un-nom-
inal, overestimated meteors caused the
delightful out of players and spectators
at a baseball game in Vancouver
on the night of the 27th. The crowd
was so dense that the "meteor" had an
angular displacement of at least 15 de-
grees, traversed a 30 degree arc of the
sky in 3 seconds. Many of the fans who
saw the meteor started shouting and the
pitcher took the cover during the 12th
inning. They tried out to catch the meteor
before it fell from the sky, then ran
for the dugout along with the umpires.
The object was huge and bright with
a brilliance like a magnitude five. A
local newspaper reported that it was
seen in several places.

Reports of other meteor sightings in-
cluded an off-course rocket, a burst of a
flaming airplane. The object was seen
in Vancouver, Victoria, Calgary, West
Kelowna, Kelowna, Spokane and Lew-
iston, Idaho.

Reports from a local newspaper of
nearby North Surrey said he had observed
the meteor and this was the largest
he had ever seen. He said it was seen
by the general public. The descrip-
tion of the meteor said the description
applied to meteors reported in that
area. It was seen by a group of people.
The one would have to be seen to have
been visible for so long or it would have
burned itself out more quickly, he said.

Some observations: There has been
an increase in the observation of these
so-called large, brilliant meteors in
1962, coincidental with the appearance
of larger number of saucer and cigar-
shaped aerial phenomena. Some curious
things about the giant fireballs. Very
frequent, large size, sometimes emitting
flashes of blinding light. Some recent
sightings they are seen over very large
areas, they make no noise except an oc-
casional thunderous crash, and are never
observed to crash.

On 28 May, [REDACTED] Pacific ST Pilots reports from two commercial ~~pilots~~ ^{Pilots} and one jet ~~plane~~ ^{Pilot} along with reports from other sources of having seen a "very bright burning white light with green fire balls coming out of rear going in direction from North to Southeast. Speed reported as extremely high to 200 MPH. Local papers want to know what object is. Reports came from Canada all the way to Oregon. Think perhaps it was a shooting star. No noise. Location 100 miles east of Mullen Pass, and heading W of Laramie AFB."
